The Associated Press says snow is in prospect over the week-end.

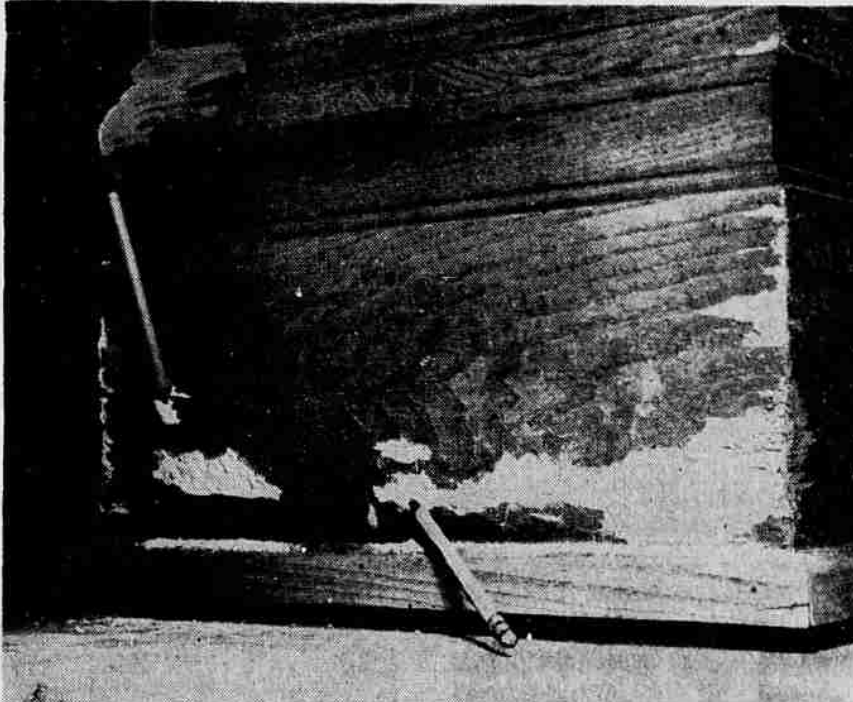
