Anyone interested in joining the folk-dancing classes should attend the next meeting, February 24, as membership may need to be limited, due to large attendance.

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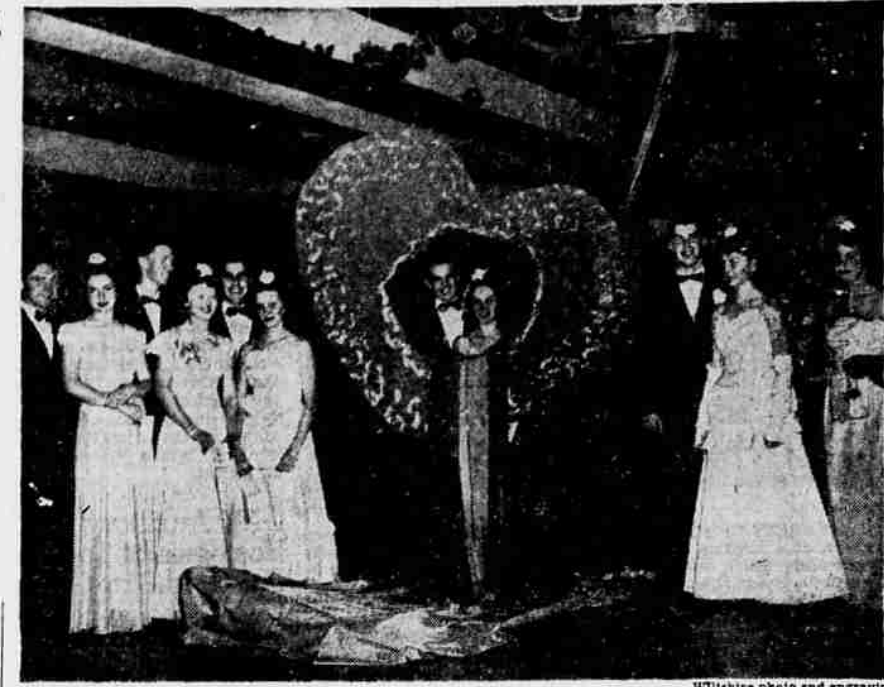
