 close to a chimney had caused an

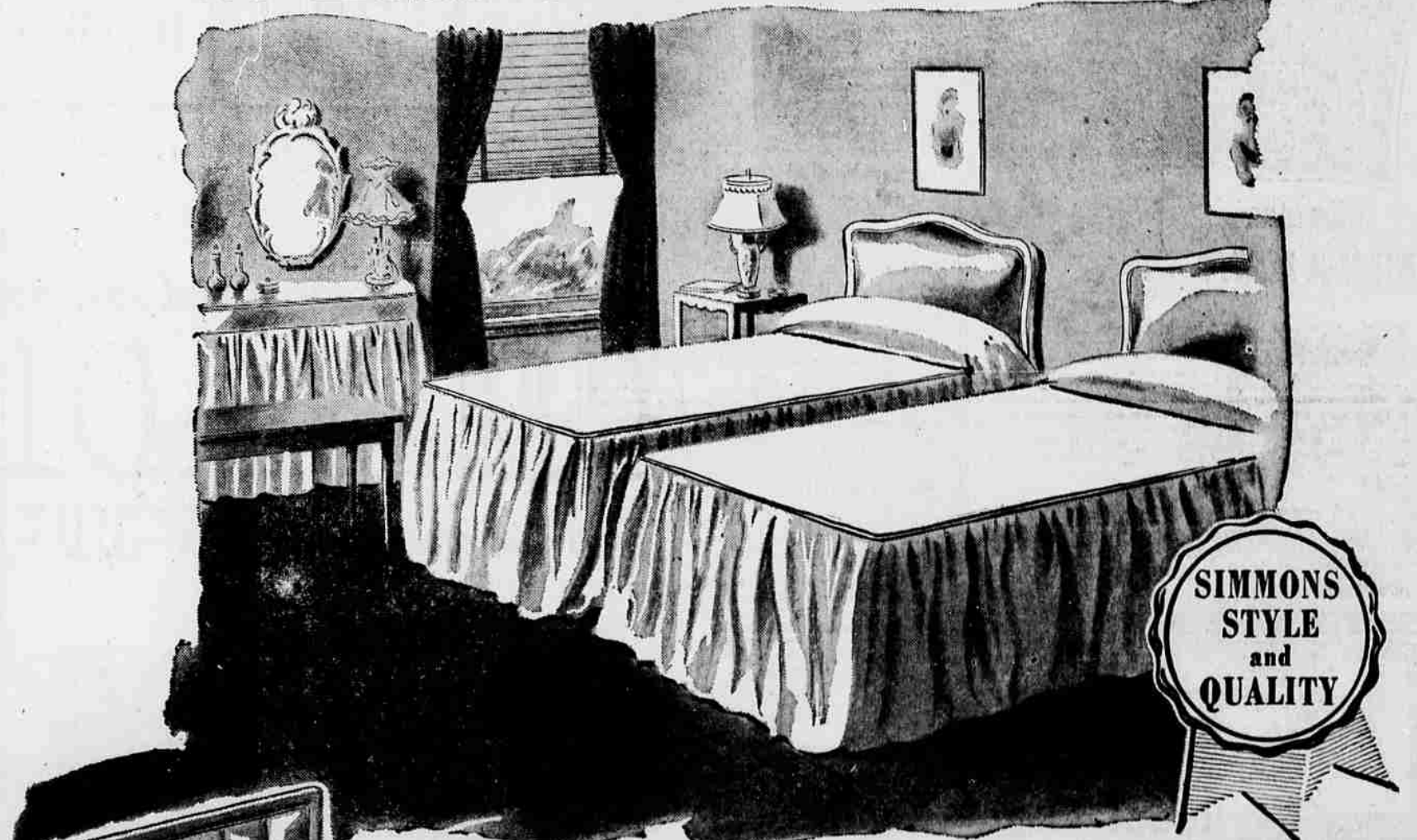
alarm. At 6:11 p.m. an overheated
