Starts Tuesday

Rev. Harold Volk, a man commended by Franklin Roosevelt for so brilliantly reversing infantile paralysis, will be the evangelist in a series of services at the Church of the Nazarene, Eighth and Madison, beginning next Tuesday evening at 7:30.

In spite of his polio handicap, Mr. Volk walks on crutches, drives his own car, swims, and flies a plane. As an evangelist he has preached in almost every state of the union and in the largest churches and campmeetings of his denomination.

Services will be each night, except Saturday, from Feb. 22 through March 6, at 7:30 p.m. There will likewise be daily prayer meetings, the location of which will be announced from the pulpit by the pastor.

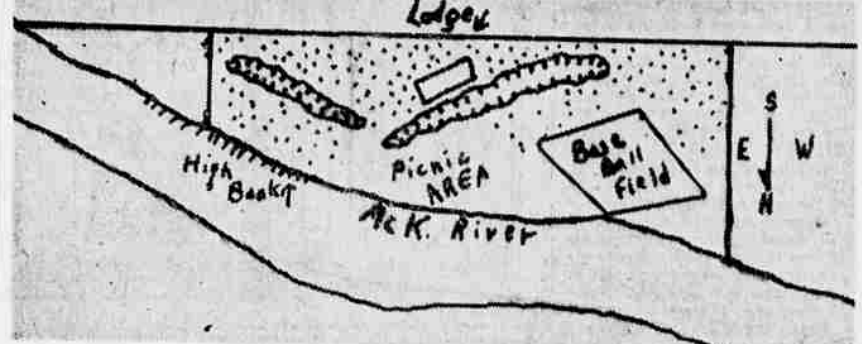
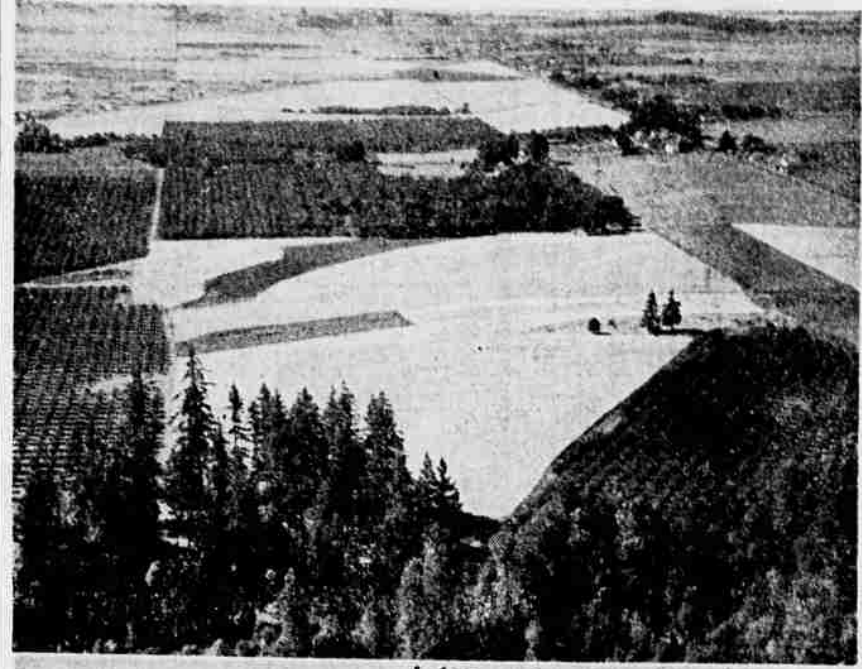

'Lodge by the McKenzie' for First Baptist Church, Chapels



You are directly above the McKenzie River, in a low-flying airplane, headed south. Dead ahead is the grove of trees in which the First Baptist Church is building a recreational lodge. "Beginning at a point" says the legal description of the tract of land which Frank Harlow has dedicated to the First Baptist Church for a recreational area, according to announcement from Dr. Vance H. Webster, pastor of the church.

And it is hard to imagine a more beautiful "point" in this beautiful valley, or one more perfectly designed for teaching city children (and adults) to find God in nature.

If you were standing on this "point," you would be at the quarter-section corner between Sections Four and Nine, in Township Seventeen South of Range Three West of the Willamette Meridian.

Now you know where thisylvan spot is. You drive out past the Lane County Farm, turn right,

drive a few hundred yards or nearly to an intersection with the Coburg Road, then turn north on a gravelled private road, and drive across a field to a tall barricade of large fir trees which stand on a low but commanding elevation. It is within this grove, facing northwest, that the Baptists will build a rustic lodge, overlooking a pond or inlet which is tributary to the nearby McKenzie River which borders the 20-acre tract on the north. In the long, narrow lake, swimming and boating facilities will be installed. Another lake is located toward the rear or east end of the tract.

On the lower ground toward the river a baseball diamond and a large picnic area will be laid out, and in some secluded spot yet to be located exactly, a Boy Scout house will probably be built.

"The erection of the lodge,"

said Dr. Webster, "will be a major project of the Baptist Men's Fellowship for 1949. It will consist of a large living room, with fireplace, dining room, and kitchen facilities, and also a bunk barracks to house overnight groups.

"The lodge and grounds will certainly be extensively used by our Baptist people, both of First Church and of our four chapels: River Road, Berean, Riverview, and Willagillespie. We are looking forward eagerly to the joy of building, and we hope to have the lodge at least completed this summer. We cannot adequately express our deep thanks to Mr. Harlow. The Baptist Church of Eugene is honored by this beautiful gift, and we will strive to erect a youth and adult recreational center which will be worthy of it."
