# Prospects of Atlantic Alliance Brighten

There was some easement over the weekend in the anxiety of prospective European members of the projected North Atlantic alliance over America's position towards the pact.

Indeed, things brightened enough so that Norway's dominant Labor Party Saturday gave the government the go-ahead signal to join in the security pact conferences. The other nations negotiating are — America, Canada, Britain, France, Belgium, Holland and Luxembourg.

All that remains now to ensure Norway's participation in the parleys is for parliament to give its OK.

Conference Cheerful This somewhat more cheerful outlook followed U.S. Secretary of State Acheson's cards-on-the-table conference in Washington Saturday with the ambassadors concerned. He is understood to have assured the envoys he believed the Senate Foreign Relations Committee had made excellent progress towards general acceptance of a treaty draft which should give the Europeans far more confidence of American backing.

The Europeans have been pressing for positive assurance that the United States will give immediate military assistance in event of aggression. The point at issue in Washington has been how far America should go in meeting this demand.

# 'City Review' of 1865 Revives Early Memories of Eugene

Except for a few old timers who remember the end of the Civil War and the surrender of General Robert E. Lee at Appomattox, the assassination of President Abraham Lincoln and the beginnings of the reconstruction period, 1865 is just another year in the history books.

But it is not just history book stuff to A. C. Halvorson, of Route 5, Eugene, who brought in a copy of the old Eugene City Review to the Register-Guard office last week. Halvorson reported that this copy of the Review, dated Saturday, June 24, 1865, was one of the

many that had been handed down, along with many old books, by his family.

Halvorson said he did not know if this copy of the Eugene City Review, once edited by the renowned Joaquin Miller, was the earliest one, but he added he had "quite a few" stored away. The yellowed and fragile copy of the Review was dated less than three months after the surrender of Lee and the assassination of Lincoln.

Lane County's leading city was then known of Eugene City, and the newspaper was the clearing house for news from the East and surrounding communities. Joaquin Miller had sold the Eugene City Review to Anthony Nolner in the spring of 1864, and the edition Halvorson brought to the Register-Guard office is undoubtedly one of the last to be published, for in 1865 the Eugene City Review suspended publication.

Only 19 years before, 1846, Elijah Bristow had been the first white man to settle in Lane County.

The four-page City Review of 1865 was a six-column paper without headlines or pictures. Most of the stories were highly editorial and coverage of news from the east was slow. Great use was made of comments from other papers, usually from the East, or from San Francisco. The big question in 1865 was the problem of reconstruction, and the editorial comment centered on this topic and political happenings in the nation's capital.

In this issue of the Review one of the news dispatch's lead paragraphs reads: "The persons arrested by the military authorities for expressing gratification at the assassination of President Lincoln, were this morning turned over to the civil authorities, and by them immediately set at liberty, the Grand Jury having failed to find indictments against them."

Probably the most fascinating part of the Review is the advertising which is an over-glorification of today's classified section. The newspaper, of course was the only medium of communication available, and the ads were mostly over-the-fence chats.

(The first newspaper in Eugene was the News, published by J. B. Alexander. It was founded during the 1856 election campaign, and suspended publication shortly afterward. Little is known of it. The oldest Eugene newspaper in the University of Oregon library is The People's Press, published by B. J. Pengra. The paper carried anti-secession articles by Harrison B. Kincaid. It was founded in 1859, the year Oregon became the 33rd state in the union.)

# EHS Orchestra To Tour Cities

The Eugene High School String Orchestra will leave Friday morning on its annual tour to present concerts in several Oregon cities.

Byron Miller, director of the 22 high school music students, announced that the group will leave by automobile following a 30-minute stage show at the McDonald Theatre Friday morning. Two assembly programs will be presented at Cottage Grove Friday morning and Friday afternoon the orchestra will play at Drain.

Sunday morning the students will play at the Nelscott church services at the Chapel by the Sea. The orchestra will be honored at a dinner following a concert at the Seaside Community Church. A program for the Seaside schools will be presented Monday morning. Newberg High School will hear the orchestra Monday afternoon.

The annual tour is planned to bring string music by students into the towns of Oregon that do not have such organizations, Miller said.

The students will travel in four cars, with a trailer accompanying the group to carry heavy instruments.

The lecture is part of the university program in connection with Brotherhood Week, and will be in 207 Chapman Hall.

# Wall Collapses On Breadline

LISBON — (AP) — Reports from Praia, in the Cape Verde Islands, said Monday that 300 persons were feared dead in the collapse of the huge stone wall on a breadline containing hundreds of indigents.

The wall was 22 feet high and more than 90 feet long. At least 360 persons were injured in addition to those killed. Rescue gangs were reported still digging in the crumbled masonry in search of survivors.

The crowd of poor and indigent lined up shortly after noon Sunday outside the Public Assistance headquarters of St. Iago Island, where a soup kitchen was set up.

The crowd apparently jostled against the ancient wall. It suddenly gave way long its entire length and toppled down on the queue.

# Air Search Starts For Small Plane

YAKIMA — (AP) — An air search for the small plane flown by Henry Deason, Yakima GI flight student missing since Sunday afternoon, got under way this morning despite adverse weather conditions.

Braving snow flurries, a helicopter and two airplanes took off to join planes from Richland, Prosser and Sunnyside in the search.

The Hanford defense area, closed to unauthorized flying, is being checked by the Hanford Air Patrol.

Deason was training for his commercial license under the GI flight program when he took off on a training flight from Yakima's Municipal Airport. He was to have flown over the lower Yakima Valley.

Unconfirmed reports of a plane similar to the one Deason flew being sighted near Sunnyside are being checked by Civil Air Patrol, an official of Central Aircraft, owner of the plane, said.
