## Red Cross Man Talks Wed.

Livingston L. Blair, vice-president for Junior Red Cross and educational relations of the American Red Cross, will address volunteers attending the Wednesday morning women's division kickoff for the 1949 Red Cross drive in Lane County.

Mrs. Julia Silva, women's division chairman, has requested that all brigadiers and colonels have as many of their workers as possible on hand at the McDonald Theater at 10 a.m.

Blair is largely responsible to building Junior Red Cross to its present status, and under his direction \$10,000,000 comfort articles were provided through schools to American armed forces in World War II, and more than \$6,000,000 worth of supplies has been sent to war-devastated countries in a continuing program of educational rehabilitation.

Blair, who has a varied background in education, is married to Virginia Kimball, head of the Washington office of Fortune Magazine.

## Police Arrest Man On Burglary Charge

SPRINGFIELD — Bill Daman, 36, 409 Elm St., was arrested by police Friday on a charge of "burglary in a dwelling."

Police said he at first denied all knowledge of the charge, but later confessed he had recently entered the home of Charles E. Yoder, Evening Drive, and removed a watch, clock, two revolvers, and a bank containing \$6-cents.

Daman will be arraigned in district court Saturday, police said. Information leading to the arrest, they added, came from the tracing of the stolen revolvers.

The stolen items have been returned to the owner.

## City Police Set For Annual Ball

With nearly 400 tickets already sold, plans for the big Policeman's Ball, to be held March 16 at the Veterans Memorial Hall, were going ahead at a rapid pace Saturday.

Officer L. T. Arnold, ticket and door chairman, said the goal for this year's dance is 2500 tickets. Proceeds from the dance will go toward building a combination indoor and outdoor pistol range for use by the police department. Estimated cost of the project is \$2000. At present the department is using the armory range in bad weather and a rock quarry about 8 miles out of town when weather permits.

Tickets for the dance are available at the police station or from any policeman.

The cubbers Pow-Wow will close with a big dinner and entertainment, Stewart said. He asked that all persons connected with cub packs set aside that date for the training course.

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## Steam Service Costs Higher For February

Because of the severity of the winter freeze, the Central Heating Co. of Eugene finds that it will be necessary to charge customers 46 per cent more for steam service supplied during February.

The cold weather closed mills and shut off normal production of hogged fuel or sawdust, thereby causing the company to use up all fuel reserves before the beginning of February, said R. P. Dixon, secretary-manager. As a result, Central Heating was forced to burn oil for the first 20 days of the month.

Dixon explains that his firm supplies steam to most of the business section under regulations of the Public Utilities Commission. The PUC provides—under fuel differential tariff section No. 1,

Sheet 4F—that customers may be billed for a portion of the extra expense incurred in the use of oil. All customers of the firm have been sent explanatory notes with their February bills.

Dixon said this is the first time that Central Heating has been forced to levy an extra charge for services since 1927—when the PUC regulation was enacted.

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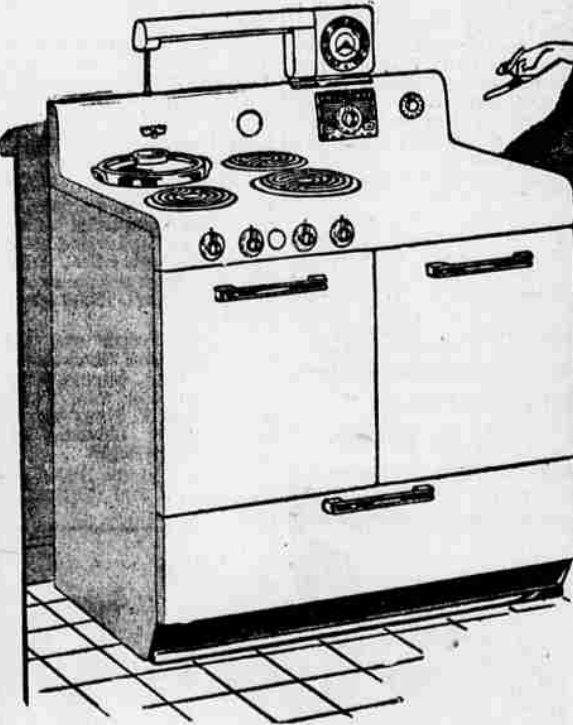
