observed, "I guess I'm back in the Northwest."

Dr. Nourse was to spend Tuesday in conference with students and faculty of the University of Oregon School of Business Administration before delivering his principal address Tuesday night to about 50 of the state's business leaders. After more conferences Wednesday, he will go to Seattle for conferences and talks in that city and at the University of Washington.

It was Dr. Nourse who coined the term "disinflation" a couple of weeks ago, and caught economists' fancy with his distinction between his new word and the old "deflation." At that time he defined "deflation" as a collapse of the price structure, but "disinflation" as a removal of the "upward pressure" from prices. Less delicate language has been used to term the trend "a burp."

ARC Executive Tells Of Relief Work

More than 100 women who have volunteered their services to the women's division of the 1949 Red Cross fund drive heard Livingston L. Blair, vice-president for Junior Red Cross and educational relations of the American Red Cross, tell them Monday morning that "the Red Cross does for all people what you would do if you were there."

"How does the Red Cross do all it does with \$81,000,000 a year?" Blair asked. "Many people have asked this question, and some have wondered why the government does not do this job. The answer is in the huge number of volunteer workers who give their time and energy to the Red Cross."

Women Instructed
Mrs. Julio Silva, chairman of the women's residential division, gave instructions and supplies to her workers.

This year the Lane County Red Cross chapter is asking \$50,000. Women have been asked to complete their work as soon as possible, as the appeal is scheduled to end March 15.

Persons who cannot give to the Red Cross at this time will be able to fill out a pledge card, Mrs. Silva explained.

Volunteers Helped
The speaker explained that during the recent Columbia River flood, 141 trained Red Cross workers assisted in the disaster, but that 141 times that number of volunteers, many of them trained in Red Cross services, gave generously of their time and skills to help.

Little by little over the past 50 years, chances for people to do good for others as a group have been taken away, many of them by the government, Blair believes. The real American way of life is represented by people working together voluntarily to help their neighbors and each other, and the American Red Cross gives all men and women in the nation a chance to do this, he declared.

Offer Endorsements
More prominent women and men from more walks of life than in any other Red Cross drive this year have asked for support for the nation Red Cross appeal, Blair said. He pointed out that while the names of most prominent persons in the nation had been offered to endorse the appeal, the Red Cross is made up of "all these important people, and all of us here, and all the people who answer the door."

Blair explained to the volunteers how Red Cross money is budgeted into the 24 separate services offered by the organization. These include all services to veterans, home nursing, first aid, nurse's aides, water safety, accident prevention, motor corps, canteen, disaster, home service, pro-

high school at Lewiston, Ida., then came to Oregon to serve as superintendent of schools at Jefferson from 1907 to 1908.

Taught in Portland

In 1908 he went to Portland to teach mathematics at Washington High School, and held this position until 1912 when he was made head of the department of mathematics. He became principal of Astoria High School in 1919, and remained there until 1923 when he joined the university staff as professor of physical education for men and director of the department of athletics in the school of physical education. In 1931 he became dean of men.

Dean Earl had a brilliant athletic career at the University of Oregon as student. He made the football and baseball teams, and managed the baseball team. As student manager of the track team he hired a new track coach—the late famous Bill Hayward, and during his senior year at the university he coached the Chemawa Indian School team for a game with the highly favored Sherman Indians from Southern California. Chemawa won the game.
