Alice Marie Board Names New Trustees

First meeting of the board of Alice Marie Children's Home with the new chairman, Gordon Olsen, presiding, was held early in the week.

Lester Beals, principal of the Colin Kelly school, was elected as a trustee, and it was decided that the members of the Lane County Federation of Women's Clubs who is named by that group as chairman to represent the Alice Marie Home should serve as a trustee on the board, by virtue of office.

Trustees now active will hold office until the annual meeting in July, it was decided.

Present trustees are Mr. and Mrs. M. F. Mesman, Harold J. Olsen, Mrs. R. P. Sutton, H. V. Johnson, Mrs. Verda L. Curry, Mrs. Frederick K. Davis, Mrs. J. Ernest Brunton, Mrs. Jessie Prosser Stewart, and Miss Myrtle Borbe, superintendent of the home.

Miss Borbe reported there now are eight children in the home, ages ranging from three to twelve years. Greatest need of the institution is, as it has been for the past year or more, a garage to house the car which carries the children to and from school in bad weather. The car was purchased new for the home about two years ago, but has had to stand outside through rain and snow.

There also has been trouble with the kitchen stove recently; three times in one day it failed to work, and the home was without means of preparing cooked food.

The treasurer's report showed a total expenditure, for the period from October 1 to March 1, five months, of \$2341.81. Receipts for this period were \$2531, \$1189 from contributions (including the Christmas gifts) and \$1372.75 coming from amounts paid by parents for the support of children.

Disbursements were broken down as follows: salaries, \$752.28; food, \$770.86; fuel, \$215.60; upkeep of car, \$260.80; telephone, lights and water, \$104.81; repairs and replacements, \$18; state industrial fee, \$10; hot lunches, \$150; miscellaneous, \$59.50; total, \$2341.81.
