Don't Just Say 'Neigh'— Try Horse Meat First

All Jack Austin sells is horse meat. And he doesn't sell it just for cat and dog food, either. People, reports Austin, eat 75 per cent of Old Dobbin's carcass sold at his market.

Since he opened the Horse Meat Market at 104 W. Broadway last Tuesday, Austin has developed several "steady" customers. One man comes in every day for horse meat steaks, and on Saturday he bought a 4-and-a-half pound roast. Austin said that he has talked to all his customers who come back and that they really like horse meat.

He has ten-rib steaks at 35 cents a pound (the most expensive item); col. meat for roasts or steaks at 30 cents a pound; horse steaks and lean stewing meat at 25 cents a pound; and liver, heart and kidney at 20 cents a pound. Oregon-Grown, Too.

Austin uses wild range horses from Eastern Oregon. Horse meat for sale must meet the same standards as other meats, although it is not aged like beef. Horse meat is as tender as beef and tastes sweeter. It must be government-inspected before it can be sold.

Austin's special animal cut is his own puppy steaks. The meat is cut from the horse's neck and gives the puppy a little gristle and bone to chew on to develop his teeth. These are two for 29 cents.

Ordinarily, Austin said, the neck meat is wasted because it is hard to cut.

Personal Endorsement

"Of course, I eat horse meat," said Austin. "It's just pork every day, do you?" Austin said that he had his first bite of horse meat in 1942 when he opened two horse meat markets in Portland. His Portland markets were the first of their kind in the country.

Austin has his own slaughter house and cannery. From his cannery, Austin says, comes only pure horse meat. No oils or soy beans. Canned horse meat is for animal consumption.

The most popular horse meats for humans according to Austin, are the backstrap and loin steaks at 25 cents a pound. These, he

said, are like a New York cut steak.

The reason people seem to be turning to horse meat as a supplement to the meat diet, as well as for cat and dog food, is the price. There is course-ground horse-burger for cats and dogs at 20 cents a pound. This, and chunk meat, are the most popular for feeding animals.

Triolo Will Ask Nurses' Raise

Dr. A. Triolo, city-county health officer, said Saturday he intends to ask higher salaries for Lane County's public health nurses in the next fiscal year budget.

He said two public health nurses have resigned from his staff since the first of the year, giving as their reason "too low salary."

Dr. Triolo said "We can do nothing but agree with this." In Lane County, public health nurses with advanced training are paid \$235 a month. "This," he said, "is the lowest in the state."

The salary here for public health nursing supervisor is \$250 a month.

The average for this position over the state is \$268.75, Dr. Triolo said. "We pay the lowest salary in the state for this position too," he said.

He points that competition for nurses, not only in public health, but in all fields is acute. (The county is one nurse short of its budget allotment of six public health nurses at the present time.)

Dr. Triolo said Oregon must of necessity compete with Washington and California and that salaries for comparable positions in these states are at least "one fourth higher" than the minimum Oregon salary scales.

He said counties with low pay scales are losing personnel to counties with higher scales.

Minimum public health nurse salaries are set by the state merit system. "Lane never pays more than the minimum," Dr. Triolo said.
