### Soviet Warns Finns of Peace

MOSCOW — (U.P.) — An official Soviet organ accused Finland Monday of violating the peace treaty and warned the Finns that the only way they could get along was by being friendly with Russia.

The Soviet attack on Finland was printed by the Leningrad Pravda, organ of the Leningrad Soviet. It was three columns long, and presented a bill of particulars against the Finns.

**Attitude Worsening**  
The coalition government of Premier Karl A. Fogelholm, formed last year after the Finnish Communist Party lost ground in parliamentary elections, was charged with pursuing a deliberately worsening attitude toward Russia.

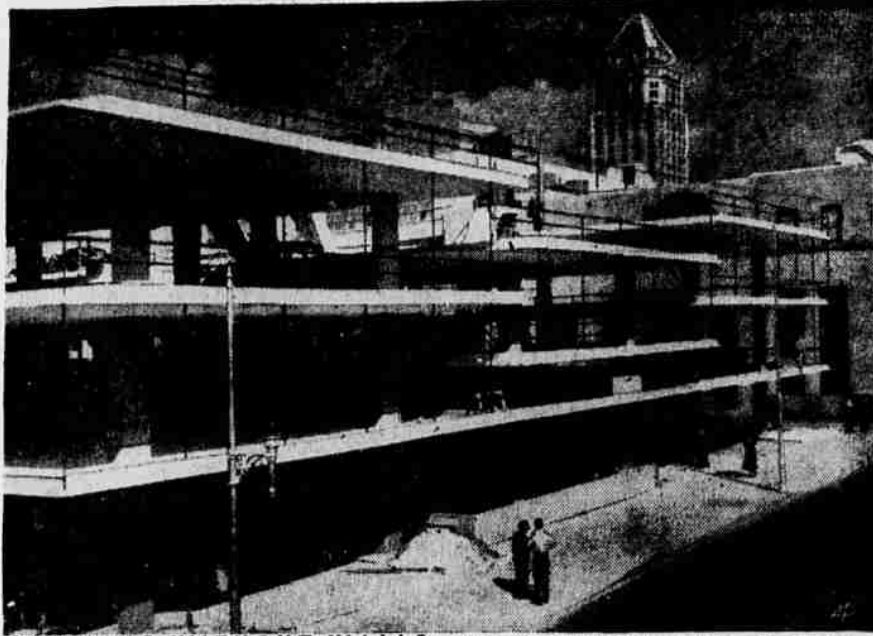
"Finland is within the orbit of keen attention by Anglo-American imperialists, who are hoping to draw this country into a contemplated anti-Soviet military bloc and trying to convert North Europe, including Finland, into a springboard for a new world war," Leningrad Pravda said.

In scoring Finland's alleged violations of the peace treaty and deterioration of consideration for Russia, the Leningrad party organ said:

**Seeks Consolidation**  
"The Finnish people must realize that further consolidation of the state sovereignty acquired from the hands of Lenin and Stalin as a result of the October revolution is possible only by carrying out the democratic line inside the country, and, externally, by a policy of sincere friendship with the Soviet Union."

Finland was accused of violating articles of the peace treaty by freeing convicted war criminals and by secret rearming and military training.

### Boggie Figures Lost Salary

LEBANON, Ore. — (AP) — Lawrence Boggie, pardoned last Christmas Eve from a murder conviction, believes the state of Washington owes him \$300,000.

He explains the amount is the sum he believes he could have earned as a high climber in logging employment during the 18 years he was in prison at Walla Walla.

"I would have made no telling how much money during the war. But I was in jail because of a dirty frame-up and couldn't make any money. If the state of Washington wanted to be fair to me, they would pay me at least \$300,000," he said here over the weekend.

Boggie was married Friday in Vancouver, Wash. He brought his bride to the home of his parents here before leaving to find work in southern Oregon. His wife accompanied him when they left Sunday for Sutherlin, Ore.

### Smoker Said Fire's Cause

PORTLAND — (U.P.) — Fire Marshal Miles Woodworth said Monday that preliminary investigation indicated smoker's carelessness caused the fire which resulted in \$35,000 damage to University of Portland's gymnasium Saturday night.

Woodworth said further investigation was under way Monday, but he expressed belief that the cause was "definitely established." The blaze, discovered by students returning from supper in nearby Commons, started in the equipment room. It was confined mainly to the lower level, but the gym's \$10,000 basketball court was virtually destroyed.

Twenty-four firemen were treated at Good Samaritan Hospital for overdoses of chlorine fumes, released when flames reached tanks containing a chlorine used to purify water in the swimming tank.

Most of the school's athletic equipment was destroyed in the flames. College officials said loss of equipment would seriously handicap spring football training and baseball practice.

### Chinese Name New Cabinet

NANKING — (U.P.) — Premier Ho Ying-chin announced a new Chinese Nationalist cabinet Monday, dominated by liberal ministers and with its foreign policy slanted toward Russia.

The new cabinet was submitted to Acting President Li-Tsing-jen Monday afternoon. Formal approval is expected within 24 hours.

Fu Ping-Chang, Chinese ambassador to Moscow since 1943, was named foreign minister in what observers believed was the first step to conciliate Moscow in efforts to make peace with the Chinese Communists.

Hardened war advocates and Kuomintang reactionaries were excluded from the new cabinet. The powerful Ministry of the

Interior, which has recently been reorganized, is headed by Acting President Li-Tsing-jen's staff, Li Hsiao-shan, who controls the police. The cabinet went ahead with the indictments against the 600,000 gold yuan frauding charges in the expense account.
