

### Special Closures in Effect For Willamette National Forest

Special closures on the Willamette National Forest will go into effect Saturday, according to word received this week by Supervisor J. R. Bruckart. The closure applies to the unregulated use of certain areas, including outcrops and dangerous old burns, and provides that an entry permit must be obtained by persons wishing to enter such areas. Entry will be for business purposes only.

**Areas Listed**  
The areas involved are: Lane county—North McKenzie, Castle Rock, Foley Ridge, Hebe Creek, North Fork, Fall Creek, Salmon Creek, Gray Creek and Coffee-creek areas.

**Linn County**—Small part of Boulder Creek area, Blowout, Bruno, Bugaboo, Quartzville, Harter Mountain and Falls Creek areas.

**Marion County**—Tumble Creek and Boulder Creek areas.

Complete descriptions of these areas may be obtained from the nearest forest office.

**Less Area Involved**  
Bruckart pointed out that considerably less area is involved in these permit closures this year and that for the most part, the lands included are of low recreational value. He further stated that these closures do not block entry to important recreational spots.

Permits may be obtained for entry into these areas for business purposes only at the nearest ranger or guard station. Recreational use such as fishing, hunting, berry picking, etc., is prohibited in these areas.

**Fires, Smoking Forbidden**  
The entry permit will provide: 1. To refrain from smoking except in places designated as safe in the permit; 2. To build no open fires except in places designated; 3. To have as part of equipment, tools as specified by the Forest Service as suitable for extinguishing fires.

The closures go into effect by proclamation of the governor, and of Horace J. Andrews, regional forester.

**Notice Given Mine Claimers**

WASHINGTON — (AP)—Secretary of Interior J. A. Krug announced that holders of mining claims on federal public lands must file notice of intention to hold the claims by noon, Aug. 1.

Krug said that failure to file throws the claims open to relocation by another person.

He said in a statement that the notice must be filed in the office where the location certificate or statement is recorded. Depeue Falck, acting Bureau of Land Management director, said the notices also should be filed with the county recorder's office if the original location statement is not recorded there.

**Announcement Told**  
The Interior Department deadline announcement said: "The necessity for filing a statement of intention to hold a mining claim is an important feature of a law passed by Congress in June, relating to the performance of \$100 worth of labor or improvements on a mining claim each year in order to retain possession of the claim."

"The new law suspended the requirement for performance of this annual assessment work during the year which ended June 30, 1949, and provided that, if such work was done during that year, the claimant could claim credit for its performance during the annual assessment year ending July 1, 1950.

**Must File Intention**  
"In order to claim such credit, however, he must, under the law file notice by noon of Aug. 1949 intention to retain his claim. The notice likewise must be filed if the claimant performed no annual assessment work during the 1949 annual assessment year."

"In public law 107 Congress authorized a suspension of annual assessment until the first day of July, 1949 and provided that any such work performed, despite the suspension, may be credited against the laborer improvements required to be performed or made for the year ending at 12 o'clock meridian on the first day of July 1950."

**Elks Equip Eye Clinic At U. of O. Med. School**

PORTLAND — (AP)—A children's eye clinic, equipped by the Oregon State Elks Assn., was open Thursday at the University of Oregon Medical School.

H. M. Randall, Salem, chairman of an Elks committee, presented the initial donation of \$22,000 to the medical school at a ceremony Wednesday.

The clinic will treat patients, train doctors in the field, and do research work.

**Coplon Trial Postponed**

### Trend Is Toward Long Vacations

Motoring vacationers this season are going just as far and staying as long or longer than they did last year, the Oregon State Motor Association, Oregon AAA Club, has announced. The Oregon

experience follows the national trend, as reported by the American Automobile Association.

Lloyd Crowe, manager of the touring department of the Oregon motor club, reports his department is arranging many long motor trips this season, many to distant eastern and southern points as well as into Canada to the north.

Indicative of the trend toward long vacation trips is the increase in the number of European trips arranged by the motor club this year. To date, the club has arranged 15 European trips, compared to 12 for the entire year in 1948.

"While actual volume of motor tourists in Oregon may be down slightly this year, the average vacation trip is as long or longer than it has been in recent years," Crowe declared. "The practical effect of this trend is that Oregon may expect more visitors from distant points in the nation than was at first expected."
