SPRINGFIELD—Several youths have been stopped and warned by city police for disregarding the curfew ordinance.

Chief of Police C. K. Pryor stated that "since many complaints have been received about juveniles wandering the streets at late hours there will be a stricter enforcement of the law."

The ordinance states that it is unlawful for a person 16 years of age or under to loiter in public places after 9:30 p.m. It is permissible for youths to proceed homeward after that time, however, or to be in public places with parents or guardians after this hour.
