Indians Raid Settlements

RIO DE JANEIRO — (AP) — Naked
savages have terrorized
two settlements in a little ex-
plored northern region of Brazil, it
was reported here.
Armando Correa, secretary of
state of Para province, reported by
telephone that a man and woman
were killed by Indians who at-
tacked Tucuru on the Tocantins
railroad line.
Correa said police detachments
have arrived at Tucuru and Tim-
bozal, also under attack earlier,
and that the situation is under
control.
The Department of Indian Af-
fairs said the Indians resent the
intrusion of the rail line.

Science Takes Fishy Taste From Vitamin A

NEW YORK — (AP) — Synthetic
vitamin A — minus the fish odor
and taste of the natural product —
is now available.

For the first time, the growth
vitamin in synthetic form is being
sold in capsules. Furthermore, it
has been given an odor of violets
obtained synthetically from the
well-known lemon grass oil.

The first synthesis of vitamin A
was announced two years ago by
scientists in Switzerland, Holland
and the United States, and as in
most cases the nation's labora-
tories were not prepared to man-
ufacture it on a large scale.

An announcement from the Wil-
liam R. Warner Co. now says,
however, that synthetic vitamin A
now is being made in sufficiently
large quantities to offer it to the
public.

It should be welcome news for
those who must take vitamin A
because the natural product, ob-
tained from fish liver oils such as
halibut, shark and tuna, was char-
acterized by an unpleasant fishy
smell and flavor.

In disclosing that synthetic per-
fumed vitamin A was available,
Dr. H. M. West of the Warner
Company recalled that scientists
for years had been attempting to
complete the synthesis. Some of
the earliest work was done by Dr.
Paul Karrer of Switzerland, but
he couldn't quite match the com-
plicated molecule that forms the
natural vitamin.

Later on an English chemist,
Dr. Ian Hellbron, carried the work
still further, but he, too, could not
produce the complete synthesis.

In the meantime, the vitamin
was obtained in concentrated
form from fish oils. It was satis-
factory, but enormous quantities
of fish oils were needed to obtain
the concentrate.

Now the Warner scientists, us-
ing the knowledge of the earlier
workers, have come up with the
synthetic substance. It has been
obtained in a high state of purity,
they reported.

Truman Says 'No Dictator'

WASHINGTON — (AP) — Presi-
dent Truman Thursday described
as perfectly absurd the feeling
that the secretary of defense
might become a military dictator
under a Senate-approved bill in-
creasing his authority.

Mr. Truman was told by a re-
porter at his news conference of
a feeling by Chairman Carl A.
Vinson (D-Ga.) of the House
Armed Services Committee that
the so-called Tydings Bill as
drawn might result in the crea-
tion of a military dictatorship.

That, the President said, was a
perfectly absurd opinion. He said
as long as the President is the
commander-in-chief of the armed
forces, no other person could pos-
sibly take them over.

Actress Reports Jewel Robbery

BEVERLY HILLS, Cal. — (AP) —
Actress Lois Andrews, former
wife of George Jessel, reported
Thursday that burglars stole \$50-
000 worth of her jewels while she
and her roommate were appear-
ing in a stage version of "Anna
Lucasta."

The 24-year-old brunette show-
girl said she and Sally Regan
came home from the theater
around 2 a.m., found the back
door of their ground-floor apart-
ment open and the screen piled
off, and discovered that the jewels
were missing.

She told Sheriff's Deputy G. O.
Brewer that the thieves failed to
disturb \$20,000 worth of furs and
\$10,000 worth of perfumes which
were in the same closet as the
jewels.

Principal items among the lost
jewels she listed was a pair of
diamond clips worth \$7000, a dia-
mond bracelet valued at \$7500, a
star sapphire ring worth \$5000
and two \$3500 bracelets.

A \$700 gold cigarette case, in-
scribed "I Love You" when it was
given her by actor Steve Brodie,
her second husband, also was
gone.

Russia Cuts Interest
WASHINGTON — (AP) — State
Department officials disclosed
Thursday that Russia, without
explanation, shaved about two-
thirds from its latest lend-lease
payment to the United States.

Pegler Charges Despotism In House Union Meet

WASHINGTON — (AP) — Col-
umbus Westbrooke Pegler charged
Thursday that "despots, criminals
and Communists" have taken over
labor unions to a point where
rank-and-file members fighting
them are afraid to reveal their
names in public.

"It takes a pretty courageous
individual to do that," Pegler told
a House labor subcommittee.

Investigate Unions
The legislators, headed by Rep.
Andrew Jacobs (D-Ind) are in-
vestigating "undemocratic" prac-
tices in unions. Pegler was sub-
poenaed when he said he has a
"treasury" of information on the
subject.

The columnist carried to the
witness stand a small suitcase
loaded with copies of union con-
stitutions which, he said, were
"fixed" to insure "boss control"
of the organizations.

Pressed for "factual cases,"
Pegler listed:

1. A Cincinnati teamster who
25 years ago found their charter
suspended and their charter
"seized" by Daniel Tobin, presi-
dent of the International Brother-
hood of Teamsters (AFL).

2. A man in the painters union
who had his card taken up and
is now "washing cars at \$40 a
week."

3. The activities of the AFL
Hod Carriers Union "which did
not hold a convention for 30
years."

4. Action taken by CIO Presi-
dent Philip Murray last fall in
ordering the CIO Farm Equip-
ment Workers and the CIO
Wholesale and Retail Clerks Union
to merge with other unions "with-
out consulting the membership."

5. A former union leader in
New York who was convicted
three times as a "thief" and a
"bankruptcy swindler."

6. A case in Boston where some
teamsters were expelled from the
union for giving testimony before
a state legislative committee that
the local leader did not like.

Tidal Dike Sought

Commission to build a dam and
dike to prevent the flow of tidal
waters into Kentuck Slough in
Cook County, has been introduced
by Senator Cordon (R-Ore).
