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Lawyer Offers To Kill Negro

DALLAS, Texas — (UP) — A Dallas lawyer offered to pay a Negro's peace bond for the privilege of killing him.

He was ordered jailed — but quickly released — by County Criminal Judge Joe B. Brown. Judge Brown had said, earlier in the case, that if he had been in the lawyer's shoes during a June 21 argument with the Negro, he too would have killed the Negro. Keep Him in Jail

It happened during Friday's habeas corpus hearing for Ozzie B. Watson, 31, Dallas Negro. Watson had been jailed on charges of threatening to kill Attorney Noah Roark and assault Mrs. Roark in an argument following a June 21 traffic accident. He was placed under \$25,000 peace bond.

"If you want Watson to live, you'd better keep him in jail," Roark told Judge Brown during the hearing. "I'm going to kill him if I ever get the chance. As a matter of fact, I'll post his bond for the pleasure of doing it."

"You heard him?" Watson's attorney, Joe Great-house of Fort Worth, turned to Judge Brown.

"You heard the threat. Under

the law it's your duty to place Mr. Roark under peace bond."

Judge Brown told Chief Deputy Sheriff Millard Sweatt to jail Roark. To Roark he said:

"That's OK, Joe."

"I'm sorry, Noah—but this is the way it's got to be."

Roark told the judge not to feel bad about it and added:

"That's OK, Joe. I can put up the bond in cash up to \$25,000."

Judge Brown first said he would put Roark under \$25,000 peace bond and then decided to make Roark's bond \$10,000 and cut Watson's to \$10,000.

In an informal conference, Roark promised not to kill Watson. The Negro's attorney then asked the judge to release Roark without bond. After several entreaties the judge complied. They all shook hands.

Watson still was in jail Saturday.

Judge Brown earlier sentenced Watson to two years and fined him \$2000—the maximum the law allows. But he granted a new trial, saying he erred in the earlier trial in saying from the bench that he would have killed Watson had he been in Roark's shoes during the argument following the traffic accident.

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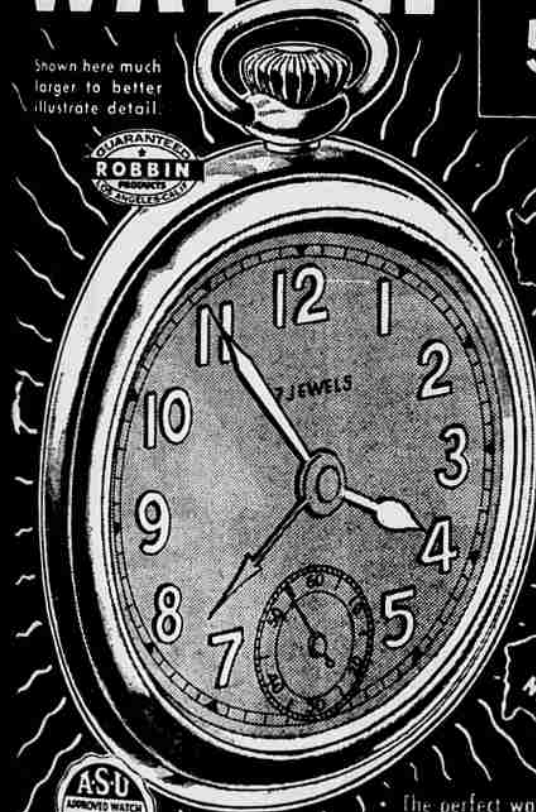
