RECIPE HINT

Savory Veal Steaks (6 servings)
Two tablespoons flour, 1 teaspoon salt, 1 teaspoon black pepper, 1/2 cup oil, 1/2 cup veal shoulder steaks, 2 onions, fat, 2 onions, sliced, 1 small can evaporated milk, 1 cup top milk.

Mix flour, salt, sugar and pepper and dredge steaks on one side in mixture. Turn and dredge other side. Cover with brown, add water, cover and simmer 1 1/2 hours or until tender. Remove meat to platter, drain drippings, heat thoroughly and serve as sauce with steaks.
