

### Ellsworth Objects to New House Phone-Wire Rule

WASHINGTON, D. C. — (AP) — A letter to constituents "was to limit the West Coast members to three or four telegrams a week because each of them cost an average of \$3.

"The scheme is merely a redistribution of communications cost with the nearby members gaining and the members from a distance taking it on the chin."

Ellsworth said the new rule was adopted "one dull afternoon when most members were in committee or attending to office work."

"The good old days when Western members of the House could make prompt reply by telegraph to urgent inquiries or requests from constituents is ended," Ellsworth said, "unless we pay most of the telegraph bills out of our own pockets."

### Strokes Send Two to Hospital

Sparks, Blue River, near owner of Sparks Ranch, well known in Lane County, in critical condition Wednesday at Sacred Heart Hospital. He had a stroke at his home near Sparks Ranch Tuesday afternoon.

Ambulance attendants called to pick up Floyd Tucker, who was fishing near the lake and had suffered a stroke. Tucker carried out a mile, in the ambulance, and returned back to Eugene when received a call on the telephone requesting them to pick up Sparks.

The two men were brought to Sacred Heart Hospital. Tucker reported in fair condition Tuesday. Both men are believed to be about 60.

### Willamalane Classes Appeal to Many

SPRINGFIELD — Willamalane craft work classes have received heavy attendance during the past two weeks, Mrs. Irene Squires, park district superintendent, announced Tuesday.

Mrs. Squires said more than 100 persons had been attending the leather work and ceramics class daily.

The district will pay for tools and clay and furnish instruction, Mrs. Squires said, if persons attending the classes pay for glazing and firing of finished clay items or for leather articles, depending which article the individual is undertaking.

### Power Failure Slows Down N W

SEATTLE — (AP) — A quarter-hour power failure in the Pacific Northwest brought the wheels of industry to a shuddering halt Tuesday afternoon.

Elevators in downtown buildings groaned to a halt, suspending their loads of passengers in mid-air. Seattle Transit electric buses slowed to a crawl and stalled, some on steep grades, while the low voltage went through the system.

Doctors at King County Hospital, one of the city's largest, said no operations were in progress at the time the lights dimmed.

Radio stations were temporarily disrupted as the low power was not enough to push signals through telephone lines to the transmitters.

Fred Treffinger, local dispatcher of the Puget Sound Power and Light Co., said the trouble occurred at a Bonneville Power Administration midway station near Hanford, Wash., when an overloading of lines cause automatic relays and circuit breakers to cut out the Pacific Northwest west of the Cascade Mountains.

"The current sank low on frequency and voltage," he said.

Clocks lost two minutes during the 15-minute period.

Police and fire departments in Seattle reported no incidents during the period.

The area affected was the entire portion west of the Cascades, including Seattle, Tacoma and Olympia, as well as other towns and cities drawing on the Puget Sound Power and Light Co. pool.

### Deschutes Dam Still All Talk

PORTLAND — (AP) — The proposal to construct a dam at the Pelton site on the Deschutes River came up for discussion at this week's Oregon Fish Commission meeting.

The commission previously went on record as opposed to the dam, on the ground it would damage fish runs.

No action will result from the discussion, inasmuch as the Northwest Power Supply Co. has not applied to the commission for a permit to build the dam.

The company asked the State Hydroelectric Commission earlier for permission to construct the dam eight miles below the mouth of the Metolius River. The hydroelectric commission said it would not give approval unless the fish commission does.

### Buck Arraigned On Assault Charge

Lofton Albert Buck, 31, Rt. 4, Eugene, was arraigned in District Court Monday on a charge of assaulting and beating one Allen Kelly. He was placed in the County jail after pleading not guilty and released on \$25 bail.

John Owens Willis, 24, 775 N. 2nd St., Coos Bay, was charged with operating a car while under the influence of intoxicating liquor. Willis pleaded guilty and was fined \$145 and \$5 costs by Judge Chester N. Anderson.

Howard Braxton Lee, 145 Ayers Rd., Eugene, was charged with being drunk in a public place. He too pleaded guilty and was fined \$45 and \$5 costs.

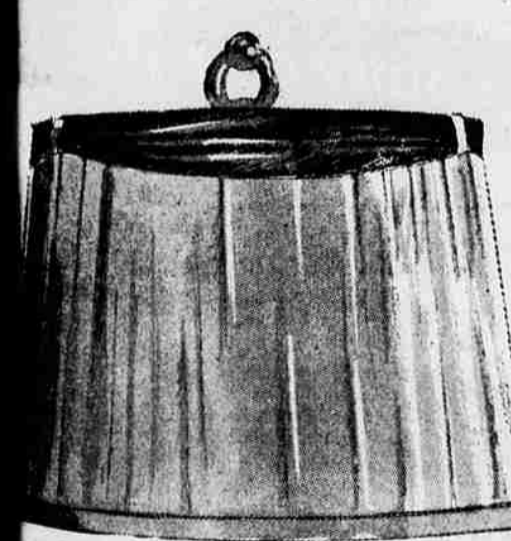
