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World Traveler Gives Glimpses Of Missionary Work Overseas

COTTAGE GROVE — She was an Army nurse traveling on the train, just back from Japan and many interesting experiences. Back of that was a grueling course in a Bellingham, Wash., hospital to win her nursing education, and back of that a difficult struggle on an isolated farm.

We were particularly interested in her stories of the work of Catholic sisters in Japan. The Polish-American nurse, First Lt. Victoria E. Kociemba, Army Nurse Corps, is a Catholic and she found great interest in visiting and assisting the numerous Catholic charities throughout the islands.

She visited Hiroshima in 1946 and saw the rubble, devastation and ruins of the once great city. Tall trees were stripped of every bit of green and evidence of living branches. The remaining na-

tives were fed entirely from army rations as were all army personnel. She noted one small bit of garden growing, making a terrific struggle to survive.

She spent considerable time visiting the Osaka orphanage managed by the Saint Benedictine Nuns which was home to approximately 25 orphaned Japanese boys and girls and also to a number of aged Japanese women.

It was to the orphanage that the American nurse and several other nurses, accompanied by a few hospital patients able to leave, journeyed to celebrate Christmas her first year in Japan.

The nurses got together as many gifts of food, candy treats and toys as possible for the little under-nourished and underprivileged Japanese children. There was even a Santa Claus but the be-whiskered old Saint Nick sent the little strangers running and crying for the Nuns—not knowing the tradition of Santa as children of other countries know it. The kindly Sisters soon made explanation to their charges and the youngsters decided that Santa Claus wasn't so bad after all.

Nurse Victoria also went to the tuberculosis hospital near Osaka which is a project of the Sisters of Charity. The nurse was greatly impressed by the conditions of the natives—she noted the poor eyesight caused by malnutrition, which also gave way to TB, a most prevalent disease in Japan.

A study of Japanese religious ways took up part of her leisure hours.

She was wearing a very beautiful pearl solitaire ring. The pearl was one of three she had taken from oysters she had received as gifts from the famous Miko Mota pearl farm in the bay area near Tokyo.

The first two years were spent in or near Tokyo. The hospital to which she was assigned at first cared for 1000 patients but was staffed and equipped to care for approximately 350, adequately. Due to the damp weather and extreme changes in the ways of living, many American soldiers in the 18-19 year old group suffered from undulant fever.

When the group of American Army nurses arrived in Yokohama they lived in the hospital which had been built in 1923 with American Red Cross funds following the great earthquake. Lt. Kociemba viewed the shrine which the Japanese built in memory of the 50,000 natives who had met death by fire caused by the quake.

Following a short vacation here in Oregon, Lt. Victoria will leave for the east coast where she will receive her sailing orders for a two year stay in Germany, expecting to board an Army transport the last of July for her new post.

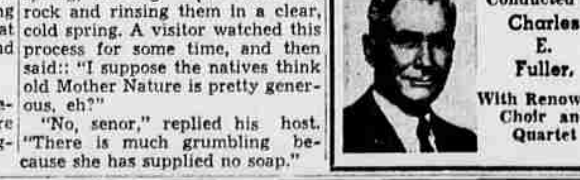
