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'Walking Man' Slates Event

LEBANON—(P)—The townspeople here are going to see next Sunday whether the "Walking Man of Oregon" can out-stride a horse over a 75-mile course at the community's new race track.

Last summer, the gentry and their ladies hereabouts were all agog over a horse vs. man tug-of-war. The horse won in that event.

The "Walking Man of Oregon" is 64-year-old Paul Smith, Mill City, who earned the title in 1928 when he finished 19th in a walking spree from Los Angeles to New York.

Attlee Takes Cripps' Post

LONDON—(AP)—Prime Minister Clement Attlee announced today that he will take charge of the treasury during the absence because of illness of Sir Stafford Cripps, chancellor of the exchequer.

Attlee made his announcement when the House of Commons met and received the official word of Cripps' illness and enforced absence for medical treatment in Switzerland.

Attlee disclosed that he personally approved the allocation of extra funds for Cripps to use aboard. Foreign exchange controls forbid taking more than \$200 to Switzerland in any one year.

Mill Purchase Rumor Spiked

J. M. White, Longview, Wash., president of Long-Bell Lumber Co., said Saturday that his company "has no plans" for purchasing the U. S. Plywood plant in Mapleton.

His firm was reportedly interested in the Mapleton mill.

In a telephone conversation White said, his firm "has no option, and does not have any plans for obtaining one."

To quash reports that his firm does not employ women, White pointed out that Long-Bell employs women in its various operations.

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Charles Hall Dies Suddenly

PORTLAND—(P)—Charles Hall, 68, for 18 years an Oregon state senator and three times a candidate for the Republican gubernatorial nomination, died of a heart attack Saturday.

Funeral services will be held at the Portland Crematorium Tuesday at 2 p.m.

He was a senator from Coos and Curry Counties. He ran for the gubernatorial nomination in 1922 and 1930, and in 1934 withdrew after formally announcing his candidacy.

A native of Pennsylvania, he came to Oregon in 1901, taught school and operated a drug store in Columbia County. Later he had a drug store at Hood River and organized the Oregon and Washington Telephone Co.

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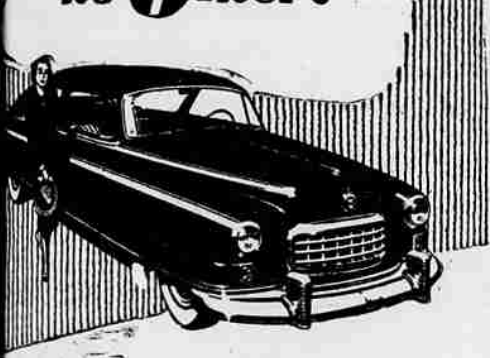
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'Appendix and I' Had Nice Trip

SEATTLE—(P)—James L. Kirk and his troublesome appendix were getting along quite well together Monday, thank you. But only after the longest Coast Guard mercy trip in North Pacific history.

Kirk, 20, of Omaha, Neb., was stricken with appendicitis Saturday aboard the weather ship Winona, some 600 miles south of Kodiak, Alaska. An operation appeared imminent.

In less than 16 hours a PBM rescue plane from Port Angeles flew north, picked Kirk up and returned to the peninsula station. A PBV Amphibian brought the Coastguardsman the rest of the way here. It was a 2055-mile flight.

At the Marine Hospital it was found the operation wasn't needed.

Stunt Pilot Dies In Air Show Roll

SEATTLE—(P)—A stunt pilot crashed and burned to death after trying to pull his plane out of a stall during an air show at Three Forks, Mont., the Civil Aeronautics Authority reported Monday.

The accident occurred during a Sunday afternoon airshow as pilot Richard S. Hill, whose hometown was not immediately known, slowed his ship past the spectators. Witnesses said Hill's craft stalled and he had made a partial recovery when the plane struck the ground and exploded in flames.

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
