

London Has Race Riot

LONDON—More than 100 police were called out to quell a three-hour fight between white men and negroes Monday night and early Tuesday in East London.

Two negroes were hurt severely and three policemen suffered slight injuries. Eight white men and eight negroes were arrested.

some on charges of assault and others for insulting behavior. In addition to their fists, the combatants used knives, iron bars, chairs, bottles and live coals.

Trouble between whites and negroes in Britain is unusual, and longtime residents said it was London's worst race riot in many years.

The fighting began on a street in Deptford, a working class suburb along the Thames where many Nigerian negro laborers and unemployed persons live in a lodging house.

Accounts differed as to what started the trouble. One bystander said the white men became aroused when a negro put his arm around a white girl. Another said the fight began when a young negro snubbed a policeman who told him to move along.

Armed Mobs Terrorize Town In Race Fight

GROVELAND, Fla. — (AP) — A mob of armed white men burned down three negro homes Monday night in an outbreak of racial violence that terrorized this central Florida farming section.

Feeling had been running high since Saturday when two negroes were arrested on charges of raping a 17-year-old white woman and beating her husband. A third negro was taken in custody Sunday and a fourth is being sought. No one in buildings.

As far as could be determined no one was in the building when the angry band set fire to them. Their occupants had moved out before nightfall.
Earlier, Lake County Sheriff W. V. McCall hurled a tear gas bomb into the midst of a heavily armed mob of about 50 men who rode through Stuckey's Still, a negro community about five miles west of Groveland, firing shotguns and pistols.

The three negroes under arrest have been charged with rape, kidnapping and causing bodily harm in connection with the Saturday offense. McCall said they had admitted the crimes.

Prisoners Listed
He listed the prisoners as Charlie Greene, Samuel Shepherd and Walter Irvin, all about 20. McCall said they admitted they beat and robbed Will Padgett of Groveland, then kidnapped and raped his wife early last Saturday.

National Guardsmen, called out by Sheriff McCall for the second night in a row, Monday night ringed the negro section here some distance from the flaming structures.

For the past three nights, most of Groveland's 400 negroes have left their homes before nightfall, returning during the day to their jobs.

Ku Klux Klan pamphlets were distributed from automobiles Sunday night.

PALO ALTO, Cal. — (AP) — The annual Melville Jacoby Journalism Fellowship has been awarded to United Press correspondent William J. Coughlin. Stanford University officials have announced.

The \$1200 fellowship for the study of Pacific and Far Eastern affairs is set up in the name of Melville Jacoby, Time-Life correspondent who was killed in the Pacific area during the war.

Coughlin whose home is in Beverly Hills, Cal., recently returned to the San Francisco Bureau of United Press after more than two years in Hawaii with the U. P.

Murray Wants Extra Session

WASHINGTON — (AP) — Sen. James E. Murray (D-Mont.) Tuesday proposed a special session of Congress this fall to act on legislation to combat unemployment.

In a speech prepared for delivery before the "full employment" conference of Americans for Democratic Action, Murray said that immediate steps must be taken on such legislation because of "the possibility . . . that unemployment may increase."

So far, Congressional leaders have set no date for adjournment of the current session. But under the present legislative schedule, many observers believe the lawmakers will remain in Washington until about Labor Day.

"If Congress does take a brief recess later in the summer," Murray said, "it should be expected to come back in September and go to work on those measures, the enactment of which is essential to the interests of our people."

Heppner Blaze Totals \$895,000

HEPPNER — (AP) — This wheatland town's grain elevators and warehouses were destroyed Monday night in a fire that caused more than \$895,000 damage.

It was the most destructive blaze in Morrow County's history. Two grain elevators, a flour mill, two large warehouses, eight railroad boxcars and two lumber and coal yards were destroyed before the flames were under control.

Wheat Lost
About 190,000 bushels of wheat were lost.

Most of the damage was insured. During the height of the wind-blown blaze there was danger that three gasoline and oil storage tanks would blaze and that burning grain showered across the sky

would set fire to homes and other business buildings.
Grass fires peppered the neighborhood and one tract of several acres burned before it was trailed by bulldozers.

Firemen were joined by scores of citizens on the hose lines and grass fires. They first abandoned hope of saving the Co-op structures and attempted to save the interior warehouse. Then they played the hose lines on the adjoining business buildings and the oil and gasoline tanks.

Telephone and power service was interrupted briefly. The main phone circuit between Arlington and here was burned out. Emergency service was restored during the night on a rural line.

Fire equipment from Lexington, McNary and Ordnance later joined the volunteers here. Mobile water tankers of the U. S. Forest Service and a few ranches were used to augment the city's water supply.

NOQUIAM — (AP) — The season's first commercial catch of albacore tuna off the Washington Coast was landed here Monday.

The 500-pound catch was brought in by the troller JayCee of Aberdeen. It was taken 130 miles due west of Grays Harbor. The fish averaged 16 pounds each, larger than in most previous seasons.

Alex Olgren, owner and skipper of the JayCee, said the tuna were running in large numbers.

Purchase price was not disclosed by the John Hannula Fish Co., which has bought the first boatload the last two years.
