**Black Magic Pudding**

1 pkg. white cake mix  
1/2 cup brown sugar  
1/2 cup granulated sugar  
1/4 cup cocoa  
1 cup cold water

Prepare cake mix as directed on package. Pour into greased and floured 8-inch square cake pan. Combine brown sugar, granulated sugar and cocoa; mix well. Spread evenly over cake batter. Pour cold water over surface. Bake in moderate oven, 350° F., 45 minutes. Serve warm.

**Suggestions Given On Building Drying Racks in Bathroom**

Sooner or later every bathroom has to do double duty as a place for occasional drying of clothes, but few of them are properly equipped for that job.

However, good drying equipment can be installed easily, and it need not be either conspicuous or expensive, says a Tile Council of America report on bathroom planning. Here are three solutions proposed in the report:

1. If your bathtub is set in, have two or three heavy hooks set into the clay tile waistcoat at each end of the tub. These can be obtained in vitreous china to match the tile work and can be installed by the tile contractor either when the house is built or later. Lines can be strung between the hooks and the amount of drying space in the bath thus greatly increased.
2. If one end of the bathtub is free, build a tub-to-ceiling drying ladder there and paint it to match the tilework of the room. The ladder is simply two uprights and a number of rods so spaced that drying clothes can hang free. A flat piece can be installed at the bottom of the ladder and slanted in order to drain water from the clothes into the tub.
3. Have a shallow cabinet recessed between two studs on one bathroom wall and install an extensible or a swinging arm rack there. The rack will provide some additional drying space and when it is not in use it can be kept completely out of the way in the cabinet.
