

Navigation Training Program Offered by Air Forces This Fall

An applicant must be a male citizen with at least two years of college education or the ability to pass an equivalent exam.

Married Men Eligible
Both single and married men are eligible. An applicant's physical condition must be good, and moral and personal qualifications must be high.

To apply for this training, interested persons should obtain application blank, AF form 56, from any recruiting station, or Air Force base. Every applicant will receive a preliminary examination by an Air Force officer.

Those who pass the preliminary tests are provided transportation to the nearest Air Force base having an aviation cadet-officer candidate board. There, applicants receive personal interviews and final examinations.

In The Air Training
Aviation cadets (navigators) will receive one year of training in navigation in classrooms on the ground and in "flying classrooms" in Air Force training planes. Cadets receive 184 hours of "in the air" navigation instruction.

Upon graduation each cadet navigator will receive a commission as second lieutenant in the Air Force Reserve, with an aeronautical rating as navigator. Graduates are assigned to three years of active duty with the Air Force. Outstanding graduates receive regular commissions, and all graduates have an opportunity to compete for the many regular commissions tendered each year.

Right-of-Way Bids Called for BPA Line

Another step on the road to realization of Bonneville's Goshen project was taken this week with the calling for bids on invitation 4740 for clearing the right-of-way for the Willamette Forest section of the Maupin-Detroit 230 KV transmission line.

Bids will be opened in Portland on Aug. 5. A right-of-way 125 feet in width is to be cleared in the area between Breitenbush and the Detroit Dam site.

Upon completion of the right-of-way clearing, the transmission line on steel towers will be constructed as part of the Goldendale-Detroit-Goshen 230 KV transmission.

SANTA FE, N. M. —(AP)—The Los Alamos Atomic Energy Project has disclosed that H. Tracy Snelling, missing director of public relations, has been suspended. Rodney Southwick, who was sent from AEC Washington headquarters to take over Snelling's post on a temporary basis, said the suspension was effective as of Monday morning.

Southwick said there is nothing new in the search for Snelling who left the atomic project northwest of here Wednesday.

He has been traced as far as El Paso, Tex. His disappearance touched off a widespread search covering the entire Southwest.

He was to have led a group of newsmen to the Central New Mexico desert Saturday, to inspect the site of the first atom bomb explosion.

Overtime Suits Banned by Law

WASHINGTON —(AP)— President Truman late Wednesday signed legislation banning so-called "overtime - on - overtime" back pay suits which have threatened to run into millions of dollars.

The law was written primarily to cover the longshore, stevedoring and construction industries. But it applies to any employment where workers receive a "premium" of 50 per cent or more of their basic hourly pay for work performed outside "regular" hours.

In effect, the new law states that this "premium" pay can be charged against the wage-hour act. The latter compels an employer to pay one and one-half times the regular hourly rate for work over 40 hours a week.

The original "overtime-on-overtime" suits involved east coast longshoremen. Since 1916, they have worked under contracts which require payment of one and one-half times their regular rate for work performed at night or on Saturdays, Sundays and holidays.

Members are Mrs. W. W. Gabriel, The Rev. Walter Knutson and Dr. John Montague, all of Portland; Fred C. Inkster, Oswego; and Dr. Franklin R. Zeran, Corvallis, associate dean of education at Oregon State College.

The division will promote temperance education, and will have charge of the Liquor Control Commission's clinic to cure alcoholics.
