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Far East Staff Made to Unify

TOKYO —(U.P.)— Gen. Douglas MacArthur has announced the formation of a Far Eastern joint chiefs of staff committee to integrate Army, Navy and Air Force components in the Far East into "a cohesive team."

Maj. Gen. E. M. Almond, MacArthur's chief of staff, heads the committee. Other members are the chief of staff of U. S. Naval forces, Far East, and the chief of staff of the Far East Air Force.

MacArthur said the purpose of the committee is "to assist in the coordination of inter-service matters and the dissemination of approved command policy."

The Far Eastern command includes military forces in Japan, The Philippines, Ryukyus, Marianas, and Bonin Islands.

Stop Signs Required For School Buses

The county school office reminded all districts using school buses Wednesday that a new state law requires all buses to be equipped with semaphore stop signs before Sept. 1, when schools will begin to open.

The new regulations call for a folding red sign not less than seven by 14 inches in size, with the letters STOP painted in white.

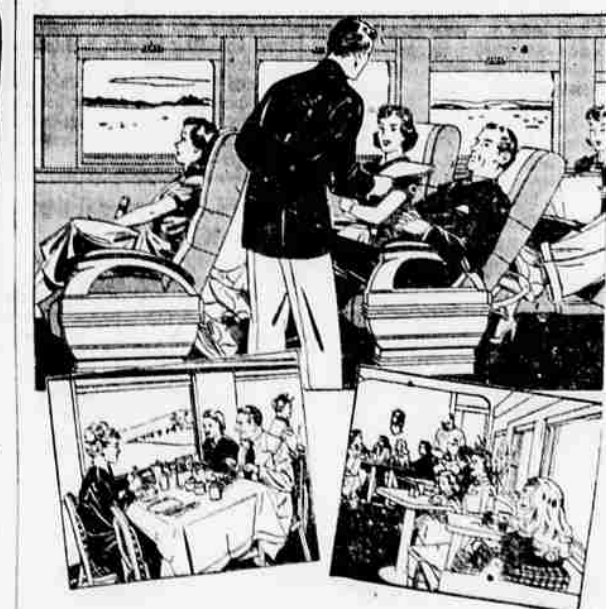
The sign is to be operated from the driver's seat each time the bus stops to take on or discharge passengers.

Tokyo Rose's Counsel Barred In Interview

SAN FRANCISCO —(U.P.)— Defense Attorney Wayne M. Collins succeeded in getting an FBI agent to admit Wednesday that Mrs. Iva Toguri D'Aquino, charged with treason, was questioned by government agents while Collins was barred from the room.

In a vigorous exchange, Collins hammered at FBI agent Frederick G. Tillman's claim that every time the FBI interviewed the American-born Nisei she had been advised of her right to an attorney and told that she did not have to answer questions if she did not want to.

Destroy Effectiveness
Collins apparently was seeking to destroy the effectiveness of a 12-page interview which Tillman said he got from Mrs. D'Aquino in Sugamo prison in Japan on April 30, 1946.

"Isn't it a fact that on September 25, 1948, the defendant was taken to the FBI offices in San Francisco for questioning?" Collins asked.

"Yes," Tillman replied. "They asked her to identify radio scripts," Collins told the jury. "She told them (the FBI) she had been advised by counsel not to answer."

"You wouldn't let me in the office, would you," he asked Tillman. "You knew I was there."

"Didn't see him?"
"I didn't see you," was the witness' reply.

"You put your head out the door and saw me," Collins shouted. "You heard my voice. I was shouting at every FBI agent I saw."

"I am not familiar with your voice, Mr. Collins," Tillman said. "You excluded her counsel from that room, didn't you?" the attorney demanded.

"It was not my order," Tillman finally admitted, "but she was interviewed without you being there. It was Mr. Kimball's orders."

With that admission, Collins switched to another tack and began to demand all of the correspondence between the Department of state, Department of Justice and military authorities dealing with Mrs. D'Aquino's year-long detention in Japan just after the end of the war.

Philippines Opposes U S Navy Bases

MANILA —(U.P.)— Philippine negotiators are reported to have opposed an American proposal to expand two strategic naval bases. A member of the Filipino group said their position had been transmitted to American negotiators. Talks on the naval bases have been under way for months. Scheduled for expansion were the Sangley Point naval air station at Cavite in Manila Bay and the naval repair and maintenance base in Subic Bay about 50 miles north of Manila.

Chinese Hold American Editor, Want Bonuses

SHANGHAI, China —(U.P.)— Randall Gould, American editor of the Shanghai Evening Post and Mercury, was locked in a downtown office on a biscuit and water diet Wednesday by 75 angry Chinese employees demanding \$9000 in separation bonuses.

Gould reported by telephone that he and Charles Miner, business representative of Post Publisher C. V. Starr, had been barricaded inside Miner's office since Tuesday afternoon and saw no immediate hope of being able to leave.

Went Out of Business
The Post, only American paper in Shanghai, announced it was going out of business June 15.

Chinese employees, in keeping with a labor custom inaugurated since Communist occupation of the city, demanded unemployment bonuses. Similar demands were made against all other foreign firms closing as a result of the Communist occupation.

Gould reported that he and Miner were held by workers who took up positions in the hallways and outer office of Miner's suite during negotiations for settlement of the dispute.

No Visitors
No visitors were permitted to call on the two men. Biscuits and water were sent in to them Tuesday night but they reported at 10:30 a.m. they had received no food so far Wednesday morning.

The dispute revolves around the workers' demands for liquidation pay for June and July. Partial payment of June wages was made three weeks ago. Agreement was reached on full payment of June wages but the workers later increased their demands when the price of rice increased.

No Money
Gould said he had informed the workers that there was no money available in Shanghai to meet their claims. Additional payments, he said, must be approved by Starr, who now is in the United States.

"It will take \$9000 to get us out of here and \$15,000 by the end of the month," Gould said.

Both men indicated they intend to stay in the office as long as physically possible.

Juror Replaced In Red Trial

NEW YORK —(U.P.)— Federal Judge Harold R. Medina ordered an alternate to replace an ailing juror in the conspiracy trial of 11 top Communists Wednesday so the trial could be resumed.

Medina instructed Mrs. Jane Schultz to take seat No. 5 in the jury box after he dismissed George L. Smith from further jury service.

Dr. Joseph E. Snyder of the Columbia University-Presbyterian Medical Center said Smith would be confined to the hospital for a minimum of five weeks for treatment of a vascular condition. His illness had delayed the trial since the middle of last week.

Judge Medina warned reporters, the public, attorneys, and other jurors not to try to see Smith or write to him while the trial was in progress. The jury now consists of eight women and four men.

New Trial Ordered In Privacy Suit

ST. LOUIS —(U.P.)— A federal judge has ruled that the \$280,000 awarded to Mrs. Beulah Greenwalt Walcher of Denver for invasion of her privacy by a movie was "excessive."

Judge George H. Moore ordered a new trial because he considered the jury award "the result of passion, prejudice and sympathy."

Mrs. Walcher, now married to a Denver accountant, is a former Army nurse. She charged that the movie, "They Were Expendable," depicted a romance between her and an officer on Bataan that did not exist.

It was Moore's own jury that made the award.
