## Grubbe Leaves DA's Office

Neison H. Grubbe, assistant district attorney since Sept., 1948, announced this week that he will resign effective Aug. 1, to enter private law practice in Springfield.

Grubbe will have offices in the U. S. National Bank Bldg., Springfield.

A 1948 graduate of the University of Oregon law school, Grubbe was admitted to the bar last September and joined the district attorney's staff.

Grubbe said that he had enjoyed his association with District Attorney C. E. Luckey, and felt that he had gained valuable trial experience representing the state and county in civil and criminal actions in the courts, but that it had always been his desire to enter private practice.

A native of Douglas County, Grubbe has lived in Lane County since 1939. He is 27, married, and the father of a two year old daughter. During the war Grubbe served in the United States Navy.

While in school he was a member of Phi Alpha Delta legal fraternity, and recently has been program chairman of the Cascade Toastmaster's Club.

### Crime Increases

As the population of Lane County has grown, the incidence of juvenile crime has increased. Neither the courts nor the law enforcement officers try to fix the "blame" in these cases. The major concern is to provide for the juvenile the kind of treatment that will give the child an opportunity to go straight, rather than to throw him into an environment that encourages lawlessness.

Youngsters are generally committed to institutions only when it has been demonstrated that they will not respond to probationary treatment. For this reason, the judge feels that it is wrong to throw the child into jail for several days, then put him on probation and hope that he will stay out of trouble. Most of the juvenile offenders would have a better chance to go straight if they never get near a jail, particularly one that is not even fit for adults, the judge said.

## County Signals Road Work Start

system proposed by Raish is the best possible for county roads.

Holland said he personally favored the less expensive asphalt concrete now being used on the Crow road. Portland cement construction costs about \$29,000 a mile, as compared to about \$15,000 per mile for the black top.

County Judge Clinton Hurd said he has opposed the concrete paving all along, but that it only takes two members of the court to do business. Holland said he "went along" on the first contract, for some 2780 feet of paving, "to see how it works."

Raish said that he resented criticism from the press before the project has a chance to be tested. He said that the concrete was to be used on portions of roads which go to pieces fastest.

Present plans call for three pieces of pavement on the Coburg Road, at points where the present road is particularly worn out. Later, Raish said, the paved sections will be connected to form a continuous strip of concrete pavement.

About 1.4 miles will be paved on the Coburg road if the court is satisfied with the test run on the Highbanks road. Plans also call for about 1.5 miles of concrete on the Maxwell road.

As to other parts of the county, Raish said the residents in the Fern Ridge area were "greatly pleased" with the progress being made in ditching and drainage, and that the overall picture was much better than editorials in the Register-Guard would indicate.

## County Roads Cause Protest

B. A. Johnson of the Fall Creek Box and Mfg. Co., and L. S. Anderson of the Fall Creek Lumber Co. Thursday placed on record in the courthouse two letters protesting the condition of the Fall Creek Road.

Anderson, in his letter, pointed out that last year his firm had donated some \$2000 in time and equipment to augment county maintenance of the road, and wondered whether the county would do anything about the road this year.

Commissioners Walter Holland and Lee Raish were in Portland attending meetings of the Oregon and California Revested Lands Assn., of which Lane County is a member, and could not be reached for comment.

County Judge Clinton Hurd said that the letters were typical of letters, telephone calls, and personal

visits from various sections of the county.

"As fast as we start repairing one road, we get new complaints about another road... about all we can tell them is that we'll get to them as soon as we can."

The county commissioners have said that there was far more work to be done than can be accomplished this year, and that the policy will be to make repairs where they are thought to be most critically needed.
