'History for the Common Man' Topic for Monday UO Lecture

The final guest lecturer of the University of Oregon's summer program will be a leading historian, who is now professor of history at the University of Wisconsin.
He is Dr. William B. Hesseltine, a specialist in the history of the South. He will appear here Monday, Aug. 1 at 7:30 p.m. His speech will be given on the University Library terrace. In the event of threatening weather, the speech will be given in the lecture room of Chapman Hall.
Historical Topic
Dr. Hesseltine's topic will be "History for the Common Man" with the theme "Can the common man learn lessons of history?" A native Virginian, Dr. Hesseltine is a member of a number of historical societies, and has been a visiting summer session lecturer in some of the nation's outstanding universities since 1928.

Russian Immigration Quota Increased Here

WASHINGTON —(AP)— President Truman has increased the Russian immigration quota by 86 persons a year because the Soviet Union has taken over Bessarabia and parts of Bukovina under the Romanian peace treaty.
The new quota is 3,798, compared with 2712 last year. State Department officials said that since relations with Russia are bad, all Russian immigrants admitted come from outside the Soviet Union.
