

Rabbit Show This Sunday

There will be a rabbit show Aug. 5 at the county fairgrounds in the new building, under the sponsorship of the Lane County Rabbit Assn. All rabbits must be shown by 9 a. m. on the morning of the show. Lunch is scheduled for those attending are asked to bring plates—cups and coffee will be furnished.

W. T. Burris, Creswell, superintendent of the show, said that there is a charge of 25 cents per head for each rabbit entered. Judge for the event will be D. P. Law, national rabbit judge.

Only healthy rabbits are to be entered, Burris indicated, and they must be tattooed with numbers, letters, or both. Each entrant must make out two cards for each rabbit entered bearing ear marks.

Suspended Sentence Given Eugene Man

Robert H. Alberding, 27, of 30 Cedar St., pleaded guilty in circuit court Friday and was sentenced to 18 months in prison, suspended, on charges of larceny from an office.

Alberding had been arrested for the theft of \$104 from the Sladden Park trailer administration

office. Most of the money was recovered.

After arraignment in district court, Alberding had been free on bail. At his arraignment in circuit court, he pleaded guilty and waived time for sentencing.

It was his first offense, and he had a number of character witnesses who recommended that the court place him on probation.

Judge William G. East suspended the sentence and ordered probation.

New Walton Plant Power Use Starts

Energization of the new Walton substation was announced Friday morning from Washington, D. C., by Rep. Harris Ellsworth (R-Ore). Initiation of use of the new 1000 KVA substation at Walton will mean better rural electric service in that section, Ellsworth said.

In Eugene, Bonneville's district manager, William Trommershausen explained that the new plant will supplement the little 150 KVA hydro plant on Lake Creek which has been serving the area for the past ten years.

The substation is in the western load center of the Blachly-Lane County Cooperative Electric Assn. Ellsworth, as quoted by Associated Press, said the new plant will make it possible to extend distribution lines to districts in the Walton area not now having service. The plant is expected to increase stability of the power supply in winter months.

Provision was made in constructing the substation, Ellsworth noted, for future installation of an additional transformer.

Lt. Marvel L. Geer

COTTAGE GROVE — Funeral services for First Lieutenant Marvel L. Geer, who entered military service from Lane County in November, 1941, will be held Aug. 9 at 10:30 a. m. at Jefferson Baracks National Cemetery, St. Louis, Missouri.

Lt. Geer was born Jan. 3, 1920, at London, Ore. He was graduated from the Cottage Grove High School in 1939, and attended Oregon State College for two years. He entered the Army Air Force as a first pilot on a B-29, flying missions over Japan. He received the Purple Heart and a cluster, the Distinguished Flying Cross, and the Air Medal with one cluster. He was killed in action on Kysuhu Island, April 29, 1945. He is survived by his wife, Lorene Christensen Geer; two children, Terry and Marlene; his parents, Mr. and Mrs. Joe Geer, all of Cottage Grove; four sisters, Mrs. Lillian Kirchner of San Luis Obispo, Cal.; Mrs. Lucile Townsend, Mrs. Lanona Myers, and Pat Geer, all of Cottage Grove.
