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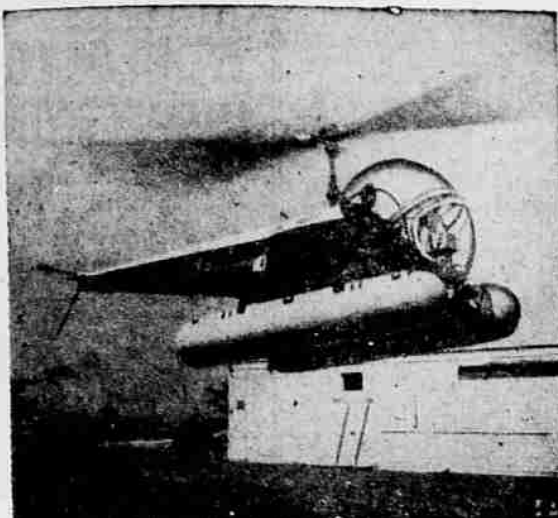
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FLYING COP—Pilot Gustave Crawford, of the New York Police aviation bureau, takes off on patrol above the city.

Ships to Evacuate Americans from China

HONG KONG—(AP)—American ships and flying boats will stand by to evacuate all American nationals from Communist threatened Canton in an emergency, Consul General George D. Hopper said Tuesday.

Hopper said only a small number of Americans had left the Chinese Nationalist provisional capital. He added the Navy had no intention of providing free transportation for the Americans and will charge them the regular commercial rates for passage.

Army, Marine Reserves Train

OCEANSIDE, Cal.—(AP)—Army Reserve tank units and Marine Corps Reserve units from Oregon, Washington, Texas and California will train side by side for two weeks at Marine Camp Pendleton here.

Main body of the Army's 13th Armored Division of the Organized Reserve Corps will arrive Aug. 14. Brig. Gen. J. T. Roberts, ORC-Reserve, will head the division's 329 officers and 212 enlisted men. Marine units will total 1121 enlisted men and 71 officers.

Part of the training period will include artillery and infantry demonstrations of modern assault and defensive tactics staged by First Division Marines.

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The Marine Corps is furnishing the Army with bedding, food and equipment for repair of motor transport and tanks.

Subway Smoke Fills Station

NEW YORK—(AP)—Shouting and screaming subway passengers pushed and shoved their way from the smoke-filled cars of an independent system train. Six were taken to hospitals suffering from shock.

Thousands of persons gathered near the station at 42nd St. and Eighth Ave.—a block from Times Square—as the passengers of the eight-car train boiled up through exits from the smoke-filled station underground.

Research War On Budworm Goes On Apace

A research project designed to find out whether it is possible to extend the time during which effective control of the spruce budworm can be carried out is now underway in fir stands of the Day Ridge country north of Enterprise.

According to Dick Berry, head of the forest research section in the office of the state forester, the State of Oregon and the Bureau of Entomology are cooperating in the project.

Control work in the past has been carried out during the feeding period of the caterpillars, which usually occurs during a period of ten days to two weeks in June.

Experiments and two actual projects have shown this to be entirely practical with more than a 95 per cent kill. In addition, large spraying projects, such as that conducted in the Eugene area last spring, have shown excellent kill results.

Entomologists have found that the habits of the budworm indicate the possibility of further control work in July.

The eggs are laid by the adult moth in June and shortly afterwards the tiny caterpillar hatches and migrates a considerable distance to its hibernating quarters in the fir buds.

The new project will determine whether it is possible to lengthen the period of control and also to control at a time when the larvae are not feeding (as they are during spring work).

In setting up the project, an area of about 4000 acres of fir forest was selected and this was divided into four plots of 1000 acres each.

The area was further subdivided into 12 compartments of 333 acres each, none of which were treated to various insecticides and three left as checks.

Infestation Counted

Before treatment, a check was made to find out the extent of infestation in each compartment.

Three insecticides were used—DDT, toxophene and benzene—and were applied at the rate of one gallon of the mixture to the acre. A total of 3000 acres was treated with one tract of a thousand acres left as the check plot.

A detailed survey will be made to find out how effective the various chemicals are. The survey will be made next spring since it is difficult to take a "population" count while the worms are hibernating.

Increasingly Important

Berry reported that the control of spruce budworms is becoming an increasingly important problem each year because of the tremendous spread of the insect in the Northwest.

Already more than a million acres of forest lands in Eastern Oregon have become infested and the insect has been found widely spread throughout the western part of the state—although in epidemic proportions in only two instances, the Eugene area and on the eastern slope of Mount Hood National Forest. Both these areas were successfully treated.

Czech Red Police Quell Another Catholic 'Revolt'

PRAGUE, Czechoslovakia—(AP)—Police have put down a "revolt" in a Slovakian town where Catholics defending their priest from threatened arrest had set up their own local government, a Communist weekly news magazine reports.

Aroused villagers led by a band of fighting peasant women had beaten up the chairman of the Communist-controlled local executive board, Svet Prace, weekly magazine of the Czechoslovak Communist Party said.

Former Oakridge Pair Die in Double Pact

OAKRIDGE—Death by double suicide of two former Oakridge residents, James "Cap" White and his wife, Beatrice Unger White, is described in a clipping from a Los Angeles newspaper received Tuesday by Vernon Ricks, president of the First National Bank of Oakridge.

The couple left Oakridge to reside in Los Angeles about a year ago.

According to the clipping, the two quarrel Wednesday and White spent Wednesday night at a hotel, returning Thursday to find his wife dead in the family car; about ten hours later, White is said to have ended his own life in the same car. The clipping did not state the method but presumably it was by turning carbon monoxide fumes from the exhaust into the car.

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Douglas Laughs Off Red Spy Charge

WASHINGTON—(AP)—Associate Justice William O. Douglas of the Supreme Court dismisses as "pure nonsense" Russian charges that he had been spying on them.

Douglas, who aroused Soviet suspicions when he and his son, Bill, 17, went mountain climbing in the Middle East, talked with reporters after calling on President Truman. He said with a laugh that his seven-week journey abroad was "purely a pleasure trip."

The justice and his son visited the front in Greece and brought back a picture of Greek guerrilla forces captured by the government. He said about 35 per cent of the guerrilla fighters are women.

He gave Mr. Truman a picture showing him with a pack mule which he said was "undoubtedly from Missouri."

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
