Governors Tour Columbia Basin

YAKIMA — (AP) — With the Columbia Basin Inter-Agency Com-
mittee meeting cut short by Gov. C. A. Robbins' return to Idaho be-
cause of the fire situation, Gov. Arthur E. Langlie of Washington and
Gov. Douglas McKay of Oregon are touring the vast basin project.
Governors Langlie and McKay made a field trip to the irrigation
experiment station in Prosser after Wednesday morning had been
taken up with the discussion of the conservation of the soil and
water resources on the Yakima and Columbia projects.

Speaking at the session of the
inter-agency committee, which is
an advisory group on state and
federal development of Northwest
resources, Governor Langlie said:

"People are rapidly becoming
water conscious. Cheaper deliv-
ery to farming areas combined
with more efficient pumps and
the improvements in sprinkler
irrigation point to wider use of
the state's ground water sup-
ply."

He cited the cooperation be-
tween two branches of the state
government—the State Depart-
ment of Agriculture and the De-
partment of Conservation and De-
velopment in state's land and
water resources.

He said that A. T. Flagg, an en-
gineer, had been assigned to re-
present both departments in sur-
veying the state's ground water
supply.

The governor pointed out that
he has directed state depart-
ments to make a study of sup-
plementing hydroelectric power
in Washington with steam gen-
erated energy.

Governor Robbins told the com-
mittee of the critical fire situa-
tion in his state and of the agree-
ment signed recently between his
state and Wyoming on use of
waters of the Snake River.

Governor McKay arrived at the
meeting after the other members
had made their summaries of ac-
tivities since the last meeting of
the committee.

While all three governors have
expressed themselves as oppo-
sed to the proposed Columbia
Valley Administration, none of
them alluded to it.

The next meeting of the com-
mittee will be held in Portland
Sept. 14.
