

Springfield Captain Finds Police Work a Bit Costly

SPRINGFIELD—Want to be a policeman? It ain't easy at times—just ask Captain Bud Redfearn of this city's department.

Redfearn was on duty the other evening when he received a call complaining of a drunk in a Main St. tavern. An officer was sent to investigate.

Well, here's the story as it unfolded in Municipal Court Monday. The investigating officer brought in Vernon Rodgers, West Fir, on a drunk and disorderly charge. Redfearn told the court every-

thing was going along fine until Rodgers learned he would be jailed over night. "He refused to be locked up," Redfearn said, "and suddenly took a swing at me. Calks on his logging shoes brushed my leg. In the scuffle my watch and glasses were broken."

Redfearn said it took help from another officer to subdue Rodgers, who was finally unceremoniously ushered into the city's box-like jail.

The other officer testified Rodgers was swearing in the tavern and created a disturbance before coming to headquarters.

Rodgers, who pleaded not guilty to charges of resisting arrest and drunk and disorderly conduct, told Municipal Judge Robert Carmichael "I didn't refuse to go to jail—I said I would walk in alone without being pushed."

Carmichael replied, "When you are under arrest, you do what the police request; they don't do as you say. These police officers represent the city and are on duty to protect all of us. You should have gone to jail when so ordered."

Rodgers was fined \$25 and sentenced to three days in the county jail.

Civic Drive Is Underway

SPRINGFIELD—A drive to raise funds for completion of the Civic Center was well underway Tuesday as contributions started pouring into campaign headquarters at Burge's Firestone store.

The Veterans Living Memorial Assn. will conduct the "gold rush" drive through Aug. 19 with a minimum goal of \$10,000.

Volunteer two-man teams will solicit funds from business firms Aug. 19, while a door-to-door canvass will be held the day previous. Association representatives said some \$40,000 in past donations had been given by only a handful of business firms. They added "more help from everyone" was needed to insure successful completion of the community structure.

It was pointed out that citizens or individual business firms could pledge money on a time basis, paying one-fourth down and the rest over a three-month period.

Timber Sale Bids Top Appraised Price

About 7,500,000 board feet of timber on the Mansfield Creek section of the BPA's new Breitenbush Power Line went for \$55,556.50—nearly \$13,000 above the appraised price—at a timber auction held Monday in the Eugene offices of Willamette National Forest.

Idanha Lumber Co. of Idanha, Ore., was successful among four bidders. The company bid \$8.10 on Douglas fir, two dollars on Western red cedar, \$6.15 on pine and fifty cents on hemlock and other species.

M & M Woodworking Co. of Portland was second highest bidder with \$54,88.50; Harvey Lumber Co., of Detroit was third with \$48,806 and Thompson Hendrickson Logging Co. of Salem was fourth with \$44,756.

Beery Estate Leaves Bonds

LOS ANGELES—(AP)—Three quarters of a million dollars in cash was left in a safe deposit box by Wallace Beery, an accounting of his \$2 million estate shows.

Government bonds worth more than \$800,000 also were listed in the inventory, ordered by superior court to determine inheritance taxes.

The actor, who died April 15 at the age of 64, left the bulk of his estate to his adopted daughter, Carol Ann, 18, his brother, William, and his nephew, Noah Beery Jr.

Claims against the estate include those of his former wife, Mrs. Mary Areta Foyt, who seeks one half; and Gloria Schumm, film bit player, who contends Beery was the father of her 18-month-old son. She has asked for \$104,135. Beery denied paternity and specifically disinherited the infant in his will.

A cigarette tossed from a car was blamed for a four-acre grass fire Monday evening on the Petzold Road between Crow and Eugene.

West Lane Fire Patrol reported one-half hour's work on the blaze. Suppression was aided by the lack of strong winds in the area.

East Lane reported no fires since Monday morning. Humidity reached 30 per cent in some areas covered by the patrol, but operators were not closed down. The agency expected a Class 4 or 5 day Tuesday, with humidity from 30 to 35 per cent and temperatures ranging from 72 to 88 degrees. Winds were forecast at from 10 to 15 miles per hour.

Soldier Planning To Attend UO

Cpl. Leonard M. Gardner, son of Mr. and Mrs. Max Gardner, Eugene, stationed at Fort Sill, Okla., has spent most of his army career in Army schools as a student or teacher.

Gardner will be discharged in January, and will attend the University of Oregon business school. At present he is teaching a typing course, and taught typing and clerical duties in the Pacific area for 15 months before coming to Fort Sill in July.

Typhoon Death Toll Close to 15,000

SHANGHAI — (AP)—Belated reports, mostly from Catholic Missions, indicated close to 15,000 persons within a 80 mile radius of Shanghai lost their lives in the July 25 typhoon.

The Nanhwei section, 30 miles southeast of Shanghai, reported several thousand drowned and 180,000 were made homeless. Sixty per cent of the residents of the village of Lohten were drowned. Soochow reported more than 1000 drowned there. Missions near Ningpo reported the villages of Langang, Tsaowai and Suhai were razed, with heavy loss of life.

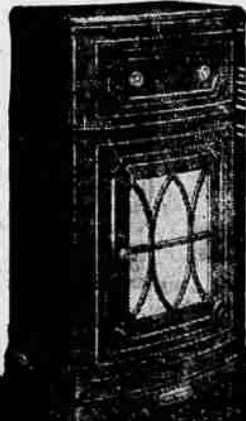
