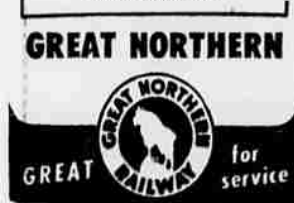
William C. Folders of Eugene, now a patient at the Portland Veterans Hospital, this week is reported in good condition, able to have visitors and anxious to communicate with friends here.

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Springfield Orders 4 Streets Paved

SPRINGFIELD—Final approval of this city's first paving program since 1913 was granted by the city council Monday night.

The council called for a receipt of bids and a public hearing on the proposed work for Aug. 29.

Streets to be paved with asphaltic concrete are 10th St. from Main to K, and 2nd, 8th and 9th Sts. from Main to North A.

Councilmen revised the city engineer's report by increasing proposed street widths. Width of 10th St. was jumped from 36 feet to 40 feet along its entire proposed paving area. The other three streets were widened from 40 to 44 feet.

Under provisions of the engineer's report, the city will pay approximately 25 per cent of paving costs and property owners the balance.

Estimated cost for the whole program will be more than \$90,000. Property owners will be assessed for the following:

- 1.—8 inch storm sewer complete with manhole and catch basins.
- 2.—Excavation to 34 feet wide. All base rock to 34 feet wide.
- 3.—All curb and gutter except street intersections and alleys. Following will be assessable against the city:
 - 1.—Storm drain costs above 8 inches in diameter.
 - 2.—Excavation, base rock, and paving over 34 feet wide.
 - 3.—All costs of intersections and alleys.
 - 4.—Major drainage structures.

Property owners will be assessed for the paving project on a zoned area basis. The engineer's estimate of cost to each property owner involved in the proposed program is on file at the city hall. Property owners may view these estimates.

In other actions the council:
1.—Called for bids and a public hearing on Aug. 29 for the grading and graveling of E St. from 19th to 21st, and 16th St. from E to F.

2.—Approved construction of sanitary sewers in Blocks one, two and three of Hunt's addition. Receipt of bids and date of public hearing on this project was set for Aug. 29.

3.—Voted to allow monthly payments from property owners who must redeem foreclosed property within one year.

4.—Accepted a copy of a Chamber of Commerce community survey report. The report will be placed on a permanent file for reference.

The council Monday met for the 24th time since Jan. 1—some kind of a record.

Union Head Resigns As Communist

CHICAGO — (P) — Maurice Travis, secretary-treasurer of the CIO Mine, Mill and Smelters Workers Union, has announced his resignation from the Communist party "with a great sense of indignation."

Travis, a storm center in a stormy union, said that as a result of his resignation he has signed a Taft-Hartley non-Communist affidavit, and that the union is now in full compliance with the law.

The resignation from the Communist party membership "was not an easy step for me to take," Travis said. "I believe under our bill of rights, for which our forefathers fought, that an American has as much right to be a Communist as he has to be a Republican or a Democrat, a Jew or a Catholic, or an Elk or Mason."

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Oregon Newspaperman Gets Long Beach Job

KLAMATH FALLS — (P) — Malcolm Epley, veteran Oregon newspaper man, announced here that he has accepted an editorial position on the Long Beach, Cal., Press-Telegram. Epley has been managing editor of the Klamath Falls Herald and News for 15 years.
