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Air Force Has New Flashbulb
CHICAGO — (AP) — A new type of aerial flash bulb exploded at 2400 feet over the city gave pictures so clear that even the makes of automobiles could be noted, Air Force officers reported.
The special flash bulbs were exploded in a string along the shore of Lake Michigan from Gary, Ind., to Evanston, Ill. They went off at 1/1000th of a second and gave 50 million candlepower.
The pictures were taken from a converted B-17 bomber which dropped the bulbs.

US Hails German Election
WASHINGTON — (AP) — The State Department hails the elections in Western Germany as a return to democracy after a 16-year break and a smashing defeat for Communism and Nazi elements.
It held out hope that eventual agreement with Russia will permit establishment of a government for all Germany "on the basis of democratic principles."
Spokesman Lincoln White said that in spite of strong nationalist appeals during the campaign, the results show "on the whole, a victory for the moderate groups."
"One striking feature was the failure of the Communist Party even to hold the small strength it had shown in former state elections," he added.

Officer Asked to Quit
GEARHART — (AP) — National Republican committeeman Ralph Cake has been asked by the executive board of the Young Republican Federation of Oregon to quit his party office.
The board condemned Cake's "inaction... as chairman of the labor committee" of the national party in a resolution approved here Sunday. The statement said Cake had failed to keep the Oregon party units advised of his activities. It said "he does not reflect the temper of the Republican Party in Oregon."

Truman Names Sixth Aide
WASHINGTON — (AP) — President Truman has appointed George McKee Eisey, 31, as a \$10,000-a-year administrative assistant.
Eisey, whose home is in Oakmont, Pa., is a former assistant to Clark M. Clifford, special counsel to the President.
His appointment brings to five the number of administrative assistants to the President. Six of these jobs were created during the administration of the late president Franklin D. Roosevelt, whose idea was to fill them with men with a "passion for anonymity."
Eisey has been a familiar figure around the White House for several years. He was an assistant Naval aide under Clifford when Clifford was Naval aide to the President. He later became an assistant to Clifford when the latter was appointed Mr. Truman's special counsel. He did research rather than legal work, since he is not a lawyer.
Recently he has been working with Capt. S. E. Morrison on an active Naval assignment compiling a Naval history of the last war.
Born Feb. 5, 1918, at Palo Alto, Cal., he received his A.B. degree from Princeton in 1939, and M.A. degree from Harvard in 1940.
The four other administrative assistants are Charles S. Murphy, Donald Dawson, David K. Niles, and David Stowe.

City Receives Cut Of Highway Funds
City Finance Officer Henry Beistel Tuesday reported receipt of \$44,232.20 as half of the city's 1949 share in state gas tax receipts.
This payment, Beistel explained, is the first made under provisions of a 1949 legislative act. Previously the state has made single payments to the various cities for an entire year. The procedure was changed, he said, to give the cities cash receipts during the first half of each fiscal year, a period in which they do not receive payments from property taxes and during which they ordinarily must negotiate short-term loans to meet operating expenses until the annual property tax turnovers are made.
