LOS ANGELES—(AP)—A congressional committee is digging into this aircraft manufacturing center for any possible evidence that politics influenced the Air Force to buy B-36 Superbombers.

Leaders of the industry assembled here at the bidding of a subcommittee of the House Armed Services Committee but they were frankly confused about the role they are expected to play.

If there was evidence among them to support sensational allegations of skulduggery behind the sudden popularity of the B-36, it was not being discussed either on or off the record.

The subcommittee opens hearings Wednesday afternoon to learn what foundation there may be for rumors that Floyd Odom, millionaire financier, sought to build a huge aircraft "combine" by merging other companies into his Consolidated Vultee Aircraft Corp., which makes B-36's at Fort Worth, Tex.

It also will query the industry executives about cancellation of jet bomber and fighter contracts early this year, partly to obtain funds for B-36's, partly because President Truman ordered the Air Force reduced from a planned 70 groups to 48 groups.

These hearings, which later will cover testimony by Gen. Henry H. (Hap) Arnold, wartime Air Force chief of staff, follow congressional comment in Washington that the B-36 investigation is a wild goose chase.

Rep. Overton Brooks (D-La.) said nothing turned up yet supports the rumors reported to the House by Rep. James E. Van Zandt (R-Pa.) Navy Reserve captain. Van Zandt's rumors, based in part on paragraphs from a Broadway gossip columnist and a mysterious anonymous document, set off the inquiry.

Townsend Plan Gains Votes

WASHINGTON—(AP)—The Townsend Old-Age Pension Plan is perking up again in Congress.

Backers are more than half way in signing up the 218 members necessary to force a vote on it in the House. They had a pep meeting and organized a drive to round up the remaining 93 signatures.

More than a dozen representatives showed up. Rep. Blatnik (D-Minn.) passed around lists of other members for them to buttonhole.

"If we make good, concerted, spirited drive," Blatnik said, "we can get five or six persons each. That puts us over the hump."

Rep. Angell (R-Ore.) made a "put your shoulder to the wheel" speech.

And Mrs. J. A. Ford, legislative director for the Townsend Plan, said the drive for action on it already has forced some action on an improved social security program. The House Ways and Means Committee has approved a social security expansion bill.

Transamerica Motion Out

SAN FRANCISCO—(AP)—Transamerica Corporation's motion for dismissal of monopolistic tendency charges has been dismissed.

The dismissal was ordered by Rudolph M. Evans, Federal Reserve Board member who acted as hearing officer on the motion.

The board has charged that Transamerica's commercial banking activities may be tending toward a monopoly in five Western states.

Upon being informed of the dismissal order, Samuel B. Stewart Jr., counsel for Transamerica, issued this statement:

"It is too bad, but hardly surprising, that the hearing officer lacked the courage to admit the insufficiency of the board's evidence. If this decision stands, it will unfortunately be necessary to have been hurt. No possible injury can come from allowing a reasonable time for preparation."

Evans said it was his "considered judgment" that the record contained sufficient evidence to support the charges.

The hearings on the board's charges will be resumed here Sept. 19 at which time the defense will begin presentation of its case.

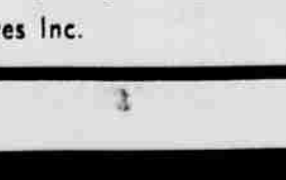

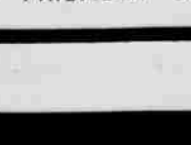
