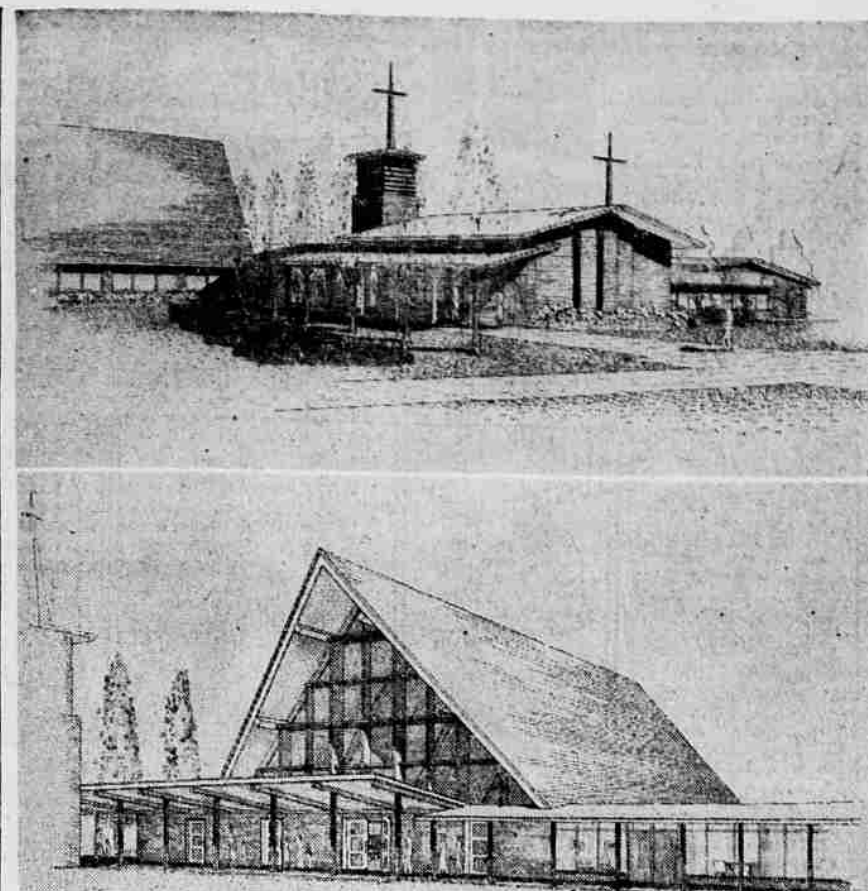

Trinity Methodist Church Plans Building of River Road Structure

Trinity Methodist Church, Methodist's second church in Eugene, is about to begin construction on a new building on Maxwells Road between River Road and North Park Ave. Bids have been called for by John Stafford, architect, and will be opened at a special meeting of the building committee, Monday evening, according to Melvin C. Moore, chairman. These bids will be submitted to the Official Board of the church Wednesday for a final decision.

This new church is a mission project of the Methodist Church to provide a house of worship for the growing population of the River Road and surrounding communities. Though its government and pastors are Methodist, its work and worship are planned for all Protestants in the area.

Trinity began last October with a small Church School and no pastor for the first Sunday. Since that time, the membership has grown to over 80 and the Church attendance has averaged over 125 persons. The church, whose pastor is Robert W. Burtner, now meets in Colin Kelly Junior High School.

The church plan is to be built in several units. The total plan is to provide a nave and sanctuary seating approximately 350 people, a chapel for youth services, Church School rooms and social facilities for church and community gatherings. The symbolism of the church is primarily in terms of contrast between vertical and horizontal elements. The vertical element in the tower and the high pitched roof of the nave is the expression of man's relationship to God which serves to give meaning to the horizontal element expressing man's relationship to fellow man in the remaining portions of the building.
