'New China' Discovered Hard to Rule by Reds

(Dispatches from Shanghai are censored by the Communist military.) SHANGHAI, Aug. 20—(P)—While the Red armies roll south and the Western nations seek new China policies, the Communists inside conquered areas are up to their necks in troubles. China always has been more easily conquered than digested, as the Reds are now learning. Two months ago the civil war seemed near an end. Now the Reds themselves are talking in terms of another year of fighting despite their current successes. Experts disagree on the seriousness of the Communists' internal problems. Gen. Chen Yi, military mayor of Shanghai, says they are merely the early difficulties of victory. Others think a crisis is rising which might imperil the revolution and undermine Communists in all Asia. This extreme view is not yet justified—but it may be justified if the Reds do not make faster progress in solving economic and social unrest. Crowded, hungry China cannot wait for slow adjustment and experimentation. A conqueror has little margin to work on. Some of the problems include: Peasant uprisings, which the Nationalists used to blame on "Communist bandits" and which the Reds now blame on "Nationalist bandits"; Urban discontent, unemployment and labor troubles; The Nationalist blockade; Recent damaging floods; and The drain of a Red army that now numbers at least 4,000,000 men—bigger than the country can long support. As a result, the too-ambitious Red industrial program for drifting the revolutionary basis from peasants to city workers has suffered an early setback. Too many workers have become jobless. The blockade has paralyzed industrial cities. They are sending out political cadres to try to get the countryside behind the revolution. When these fail, troops enter. The pro-Red press says that during May, June and July, more than 40,000 Kuomintang (Nationalist) "agents and armed bandits" have been wiped out in Central and East China and 28,000 small arms captured, plus 600 machine guns and even some artillery. This gives an idea of the extent of rural troubles.

White Dwarf Stars No Longer So Rare, Dr. Pruett Reports

Astronomer, Extension Division, Oregon Higher Education System "In an old World Almanac I came across an article about a dwarf star named after van Maanen of Mt. Wilson. It was smaller than the earth and one cubic inch would weigh seven tons. Will you give us some information on this?" (G.G.J., Seattle). This is just one of a class of stars now called white dwarfs, and until fairly recently entirely unknown. Most of the long-known white stars are giants, extremely hot and luminous, and for this reason visible from great distances. Dwarf stars have long been listed, but most of them have been toward the red end of the color scale. The white dwarfs are very hot stars, but because of their small volume are not very luminous. The first one of this type was discovered long before it was ever seen. This may seem strange, but it came about in this way: German Observed. Over 100 years ago when the German astronomer Bessel was working on stellar distances he made many observations on Sirius, the brilliant star which glitters in the southern sky during the winter and spring. He found that it had a sort of wavy motion and predicted that this was due to an unseen companion star which revolved around it. In 1862 Alvin Clark, the noted telescope maker, while testing a new 18-inch refractor, spied the tiny object, now known as Sirius B, nesting in the rays of the "brilliant star." By methods too technical for popular articles it was found that this small star was so massive that a pint of it if brought to the earth would weigh fully 40,000 pounds. So unusual was this that mathematical astronomers thought surely they had made a grievous error, but the most careful calculations always brought the same solution. Rarity 15 Years Ago Only 15 years ago, astronomy books still spoke of white dwarfs as great rarities. Only 12 were listed in a text of 1939; by 1941, 38. But the work of Dr. Luyten of the University of Minnesota rapidly increased the number, so that by August 1948 the 100th white dwarf was discovered. Since then others have "come to light." The Harvard Announcement Card of June 21, 1949, listed the 110th. The attempted explanation of these massive white stars is this: Minute invisible atoms of which all matter is thought to be composed are made up of relatively heavy nuclei at considerable distances from which light electrons revolve like planets around the sun. The volume of the atom under normal conditions is thus principally empty space and occupies great volume. But for some reason the atoms in the white dwarfs have become stripped of the electrons and the nuclei pack tightly together. Many known stars of this type are far denser than Sirius B.

House May Halt Action on Bills

WASHINGTON, Aug. 20—(AP)—House leaders admitted tonight that a mass walkout of vacation-bound members may bring the chamber's legislative machinery to a halt by mid-week. A Democratic leader said that members are leaving the city at the rate of 20 a day. The critical point is 217—a quorum. If the membership drops below that, legislation is impossible. "We just can't keep them here much longer," the Democrat said. "They want to spend a couple of weeks with their families before school starts and they won't stick around." At stake are some \$27,000,000 worth of appropriation bills. All of them have been passed by the House but the Senate either has made changes or will make changes in each one. A measure must be approved by both branches of Congress in identical form before it can go to the White House to become law. Whether the Senate goes on, speeds up, or gets even slower it won't make much difference if the House isn't here to complete the legislative process. Democratic whip J. Percy Priest, Tenn., whose job it is to keep a quorum present so the House can function, was asked what he will do about the growing walkout of members. "That," he replied, "is a question that is going to cost me a lot of sleep over the week end."

Tourists Exposed To Polio Banned

LAREDO, Tex., Aug. 20—(AP)—Mexico moved today to close its gateways to United States tourists unable to prove they had not been exposed to poliomyelitis. Dr. Salvador Chapa Garza, Mexican federal health director at Nuevo Laredo, slapped on the ban at mid-morning, minutes after the health ministry in Mexico City telegraphed him the order. Within the first few hours, 50 to 60 tourist cars were turned back at Nuevo Laredo and the number mounted throughout the day. At Matamoros, just across the Rio Grande from Brownsville, Mexican Health Director Dr. Oscar Cano Trujillo said he understood the order would apply to everyone entering the country. Late in the day, no certificates had been asked of motorists crossing into Mexico at the two international bridges in Brownsville. Cano Trujillo said the necessary machinery for the health watch hadn't been set up. But at Brownsville's international airport, two U. S. tourists had to secure health certificates before officials would clear them for a flight to the interior.

Park Fire Rages

WEST YELLOWSTONE, Mont.—(AP)—National Park officials Saturday night issued an urgent call for fire fighters to battle a one-and-one-half mile long forest fire which was flashing uncontrolled and unmaned through 500 acres of heavy timberland within the boundaries of Yellowstone National Park.

Ruler's White Queen Sees Africa Domain

FRANCISTOWN, British Bechuanaland Protectorate, Aug. 20—(AP)—The 24-year-old British ex-tyrist who some day may be white queen of the Bamangwato tribe arrived by plane from England today for her first view of her African husband's domain. Tribesmen danced and sang their welcome in apparent disregard of the squabble kicked up by their elder statesmen over chief-designate Seretse Khama's marriage to the blonde English girl, Ruth Williams. Some of the elders went into exile rather than accept her. The small European who knew she was coming—Miss Jones—but stopped on her arrival. The black and white couple braced warmly upon her arrival. They were married while he was studying law in England. There were no police or government officials in the wedding party. The 27-year-old chief-designate then left by car for Seretse Khama's 100,000-acre Bamangwato with reporters or to answer phone calls from London.
