

### Local Lad Wins Contest

Kommer, graduate of High School, has been announced winner of the Future Farmers of America Better Farming contest in the southwestern district. The contest is sponsored by the Kiwanis Clubs to encourage FFA members to improve individual farming practices on the home farm. Kommer served as vice-president of the Eugene FFA chapter last year and was a member of the Pacific team judging at the International Livestock Exposition. He was outstanding in stock improvement, and was member of the Lane County Breeders Assn. He raised several Jersey hogs, established a farm poultry flock from stock obtained from the cooperative in the National Poultry Improvement Assn., improved his beef stock. He has eight acres of hay and has 14 acres for hay production. He has installed an electric irrigation system and a chicken house, took over the largest share of management of his father's

property. Johnny also helped the neighbors during harvest season. During the annual Parent and Son banquet he was awarded the United States National Bank Project award for having the most outstanding project in the Eugene chapter in the current year, and at the state FFA convention at Tillamook he was elected to the State Farmer Degree. Johnny will have a booth at the State Fair and Lane County Fair this year.

### Youths Missing In Germany

FRANKFURT, Germany—(AP)—U.S. High Commissioner John J. McCloy has personally ordered a "top priority" search for two American youth missing in Germany for nearly two weeks, American investigators disclosed Saturday.

The said agents of the super-secret counter intelligence Corps (CIC) have been drafted into the search for Warren Oelsner, 21, of Oyster Bay, L.I. and Peter Sellers, 19, of Radnor, Penn.

They vanished in the British zone of Germany after having inquired about the possibility of riding their bicycles through the Russian zone to Berlin.

### Navy Reserve Plan Takes in Women

The U.S. Naval Reserve Program has been expanded, allowing women without previous military experience to enroll, it was announced this week. Women high school graduates, between the ages of 18 and 40, who have no minor dependents, are eligible. In Eugene they may telephone 5-1041 for more information.

Reservists need not quit their jobs or give up their social life. They stay civilians and become eligible to receive navy training in their spare time. They may join the Naval Reserve units that meet weekly at the Training Center, 1520 13th Ave. W. This is the first opportunity that non-veteran women have had to join the Naval Reserve.

### Novel Cycling Act To Be at County Fair

A European novelty cycling act has been signed to play daily at the Lane County Fair Sept. 21-24, Fair Manager Herb Welch has announced.

The act will be presented by two young women known as the Diacoffs from London, England, who ride bicycles in a specially-built Veedome. They ride at a 45 degree angle, passing each other with only seven inches to spare. They also ride blindfolded and without using the handlebars.

Welch said the act is the only one of its kind in the world today.

### China Reds Newspaper Hits at U.S.

NANKING—(AP)—The Communist-controlled press Saturday fired its heaviest propaganda broadside against the United States.

The daily, bitter press attacks reached a new height of intensity in editorials, which practically choked news off front pages.

The anti-American propaganda campaign has been sharply accelerated by publication of the U. S. white paper on China. (The white paper laid down a policy of aiding Chinese to cast off the "foreign yoke" of a Red regime which served Russian imperialism.)

**Fifth Column**  
The official Communist Hsinhua (New China) Agency charged the United States with fostering a fifth column behind Red lines and with encouraging and assisting sabotage by "Nationalist special bandits."

(The Nationalists, when they were riding high, referred to the Communists as "bandits.")

With the opening of large-scale campaigns to suppress peasant unrest in north, central and east China, the Communists repeatedly have said the United States is backing Nationalist agents who are supposed to be leading the insurrections.

The agency's editorial said Secretary of State Acheson's statement of basic principles meant a policy of supporting China's warlords and continuing the economic blockade of Communist ports.

In explaining away the Nationalist blockade, the Communists consistently place the blame on the United States.

Criticism also was heaped upon U. S. Ambassador J. Leighton Stuart, now in Washington. This criticism significantly is aimed at educated Chinese opinion.

It urges this section of Chinese life to drop "illusions about America." Stuart, a lifelong resident of China who is a noted missionary and educator, has a large following among Chinese intellectuals. The diatribes seem aimed at eliminating this following.

### Police Probe Slaying

OGDEN, Utah—(AP)—A youth who killed a woman and left her nude body in a hotel room here was questioned Saturday about the slaying last month of a pretty 17-year-old Mormon Sunday school teacher.

Richard Dix Pack, 23, of Pocatello, Idaho, confessed Friday that he slew Shirley V. Scott, Seattle, in a hotel here where they registered for illicit purposes.
