## Camp Creek Contract Let

SPRINGFIELD — District 19's school board Monday awarded Albert Vik and Son, Eugene contractors, contract for construction of the proposed Camp Creek grade school.

Vik's bid of \$25,756.30 was nearly \$3000 under a bid submitted by J. S. Crepeau.

E. H. Silke, superintendent of schools, Tuesday said bids for the Camp Creek school had been rejected two weeks ago. Low bid then was \$33,046.

Silke said the new contract called for no change in the school's two class rooms, only for a modification in heating facilities.

Construction is expected to start in early September, the superintendent said. The building will be in use sometime between Thanksgiving and Christmas.

Silke said the present Upper and Lower Camp Creek schools would remain in use until the new structure is completed.

Grades one, two and three will attend Upper Camp Creek this fall, Silke said, while fourth, fifth and sixth graders will attend Lower Camp Creek. Bus service will be provided.

The board indicated Monday it would study plans concerning a hot lunch program for all schools in the district.

Silke said eastern schools had successfully developed a plan whereby meals were prepared in a centrally located kitchen and transported to nearby schools in special conveyances.

Under a similar system here, Silke added, such schools as Mohawk, Goshen and Waterville could be provided with hot noon meals.

During the past school year the district served 247,967 meals, Silke said approximately 300,000 would be served during the coming school year. He added the government paid four and one-half cents to the district for each meal served.

Special guests attending the board meeting were Arthur Eastman, Waterville; Harold Dunn, Mohawk; Ed Roberts, Upper Camp Creek; Oswald Peterson, Lower Camp Creek.
