Wallgren Hints He Still Hopes For Federal Job

SEATTLE — (AP) — Former Democratic Washington Gov. Mon C. Wallgren may still get a federal position, the Seattle Post-Intelligencer reported Monday.

The close friend of President Truman told a reporter that he is inside of a month—possibly to take a federal position.

Wallgren described himself as a "free lance" and "merely a private citizen" in his talk before several thousand persons at the King County Democratic Picnic Sunday.

His appointment to the National Security Resources Board directorship was blocked earlier this year. He indicated in conversations with friends, the Post-Intelligencer revealed, that the important job may still materialize.

After being named to the post by the president, Wallgren was sidetracked when a Senate committee voted against confirmation. Discussing no specific position in his interview, Wallgren said he "might" take a federal post.

The Seattle newspaper, however, said, "through close friends" it was learned that:

"1. Wallgren thinks that under the reorganization plan just approved by Congress, the security job now may be one in which President Truman has the full and final say—with Senate confirmation unnecessary."

"2. Wallgren seriously is considering a federal job in the interest of his own future security."

Enrollment Jump Expected At Bethel Schools

BETHEL — Pupil enrollment in School District No. 52 is expected to jump 25 per cent over last year's student population in the first 8 grades, Superintendent Tom Powers has announced.

For the school year 1948-1949, a total of 672 children were enrolled in the first 8 grades from Bethel, Irving, Danebo, Malabon, and Clear Lake areas. School population for that year increased 29 per cent over the 1947-1948 enrollment, Powers said.

Total enrollment in Bethel schools for 1948-1949 will be from 600 to 650 children, he said, for the first 6 grades; and between 350 and 400 students are expected in the upper 6 grades—seventh grade through high school.

"This year," Powers said, "we plan to operate 8 classrooms at Danebo School; 5 classrooms at Irving School; and 10 at Bethel, making a total of 23 classrooms for instructing children of the 6 grades."

"As an indication of our school population increase, this can be compared with last year's 22 classrooms for the first 8 grades."

Patient Hurt In Car Crash

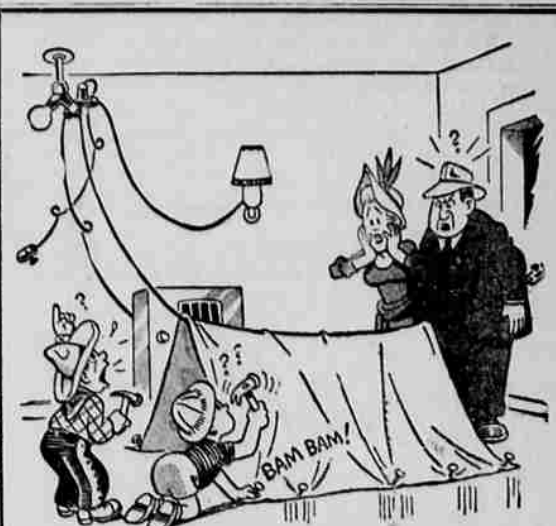
