County Fair Health Codes Told to Group

Victor Morgan, Lane County Sanitarian Saturday explained health regulations to groups interested in sponsoring food concessions at the county fair and to members of the fair board.

Morgan voiced recommendations set down by Dr. A. Triolo, director of the county health department, concerning care of food and observance of general health regulations. Concession keepers were asked to conform with the following regulations:

1. All milk products, ice cream, cream filled pastries, meat, shell fish and ice must come from approved sources.
2. China, silverware and glasses must be cleaned and treated for bacteria according to existing regulations.
3. Perishable foods must be kept at a temperature of 50 degrees or lower.
4. Adequate protection for food against flies and dirt must be provided.
5. Use of paper cups, spoons, and plates is recommended.
6. Adequate toilet facilities must be provided.
7. Soap and sanitary paper towels are recommended for rest rooms.

Dr. Jay Hicks, president of the Lane County Fair Board, said representatives of legion, church, and other social organizations attended the meeting.

Truman Scorns 'Trick Solutions'

Legionnaires Hear Chief Describe Economic Task

PHILADELPHIA—(AP)—President Truman warned Monday on the eve of Anglo-American dollar talks that the United States is not interested in "trick solutions" to the world's economic problems.

Mr. Truman promised, however, all possible cooperation in helping world recovery, which, he said, would thwart Russia's aim of achieving world domination by prolonging "the distress and suffering of free nations."

"We are not engaged in a charitable enterprise," Mr. Truman told the annual convention of the American Legion.

The United States will, however, he said, seek to promote international prosperity through the European Recovery Program, the world bank, the national monetary fund and his own "point four" program of promoting underdeveloped foreign areas.

Use Resources
To stop another disastrous world-wide depression and creation of "tyranny and slavery" in many nations, Mr. Truman told his fellow Legionnaires, the United States must be "alert to new developments, and turn to advantage every possible resource."

"World prosperity is necessary to world peace," he said. "Furthermore, world prosperity is necessary to our own prosperity in the United States."

Even as the President spoke, financial experts of the United States, Canada and Great Britain met in Washington for technical discussions as a prelude to the

JUNEAU, Alaska—(AP)—A spectacular waterfront blaze destroyed the Juneau Spruce Corporation plant Monday.

Flames lighted the sky over Gastineau Channel for several hours as the entire forces of the Juneau and Douglas fire departments fought the fire. Army and Coast Guard craft assisted, spraying thousands of gallons of water on the inferno which finally was brought under control about two hours after it started.
