over the street and screamed through the palm trees. The hurricane took at least three lives, caused 58 injuries and millions of dollars of damage.

PEEKSKILL, N. Y.—(U.P.)—State police sought the assailants of 11 persons injured in an anti-Communist riot that broke up a scheduled Paul Robeson concert Saturday night.

Detectives had lists of names of persons reportedly involved in the fist-fighting, stone and bottle throwing between 300 to 400 was veterans and the 150 persons assembled to hear the negro baritone. However, no one had been brought in for questioning, troopers said.

Robeson, who never reached the concert because the fighting began before his arrival, demanded Sunday an investigation to determine who gives "orders" to the American Legion and Veteran of Foreign Wars.

Robeson said state and federal officials should look carefully into the activities of the Legion, VFW and Ku Klux Klan.

"I am not going to be frightened by any Legionnaires," he said at a press conference in New York. "They had better be careful."

Members of the Legion, VFW and two other veterans organizations staged an anti-Communist demonstration near the picnic grove scene of the Saturday night concert. The riot flared before the concert got underway and in the fighting that followed, several automobiles were damaged.

Broken Pump Drops City Water Supply

Eugene's water supply dropped dangerously low Saturday. Not because of a new consumption record, however.

One of the two main pumps at the Hayden Bridge intake on the McKenzie River jammed at 8 a.m., and despite concerted efforts of Water and Electric Board crews, it could not be repaired until after assistance was received from the Eugene Fire Department.

The fire department sent a pumper truck to Hayden Bridge at 7:45 p. m. to help keep the pump pit dry while repairs were made. The truck was in service four hours, and then, at about 1 a. m. Sunday, the big water supply pump was put back in operation.

Crews found the source of all the trouble in a small water-logged piece of wood that had jammed the mechanism. Meanwhile, the water level in the city's main reservoirs fell approximately 23 feet.
