U.S. Factories Speed Output; Prospects Good

NEW YORK — (U.P.) — For the first time since last November the wheels in America's mills and factories are turning faster.

After eighty steady months of falling output, the industrial pace has quickened in August, the Federal Reserve Board says.

Flanking this pleasant news are reports of increasing steel production, record auto output, reviving department store sales in New York City, and return of workers to refrigerator plants where a spurt in orders is boosting output.

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Howley Expects Red Trickery

BERLIN — (U.P.) — Brig. Gen. Frank L. Howley predicted Wednesday Russia would try more tricks to out the Western Allies from Berlin.

The retiring U.S. Commandant of Berlin told a news conference "they will keep trying tricks and pressure as long as they think they can get away with it."

"My guess is that they won't get away with it and I would advise them not to try."

Howley, who published Wednesday an 80,000 word report on his four years as American chief in Berlin, said America "is not willing to let bygones be bygones and forget everything that has happened here in the past. We will not forget the lessons we have learned."



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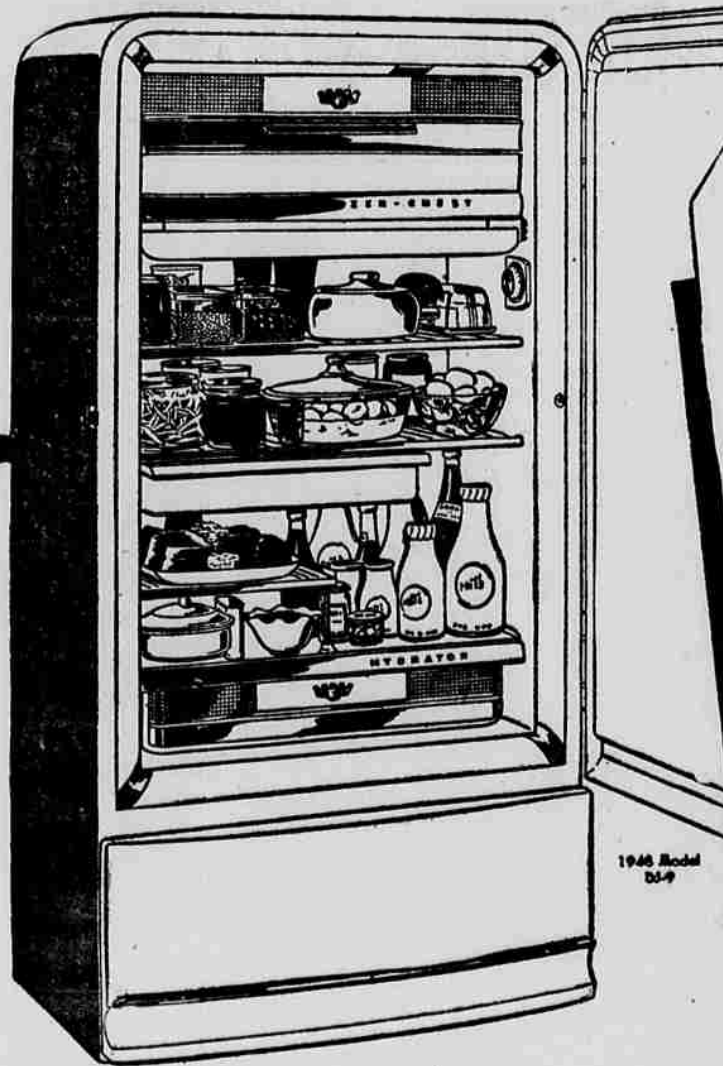
STILL GOING STRONG
