Tualatin River Pollution Seen

PORTLAND —(AP)—More State Sanitary Commission engineers are checking the Tualatin River for pollution sources in the wake of protests from valley residents about dead fish in the river.

Curtis M. Everts Jr., commission engineer, said the Forest Grove municipal sewage disposal system would be given a thorough check. He reported the city's plans for purifying the sewage have been unsatisfactory since 1942.

Meanwhile, State Game Commission biologists are also busy along the section of the stream where the aquatic life has been destroyed. Trout and scrap species have been floating on the top of the disclosed water for several days.

Street Paving Will Continue

SPRINGFIELD — Paving of 10th St. will not be halted by the city despite the protest of a large number of property owners.

This was decided by the city council Wednesday night in a hastily-called special session. Mayor B. P. Larson called the meeting to reconsider council action taken Aug. 31 in awarding a paving contract to the Del R. Beebe Construction Co., a Eugene firm.

Larson told councilmen paving operations, already underway, should be halted. He said remonstrance petitions contained too many signatures to ignore, even though petitions may not have contained the necessary two-thirds to stop paving.

City Attorney Marvin Sanders pointed out that the city council executed a binding contract with the Beebe Construction Co. at the last council meeting and was obligated to either follow contract terms or pay several thousand dollars in damages to the contractor for breaking the agreement.

Councilman J. W. Boeshans said the city was not wrong in ordering the paving of 10th St. He said there was no justification to stop work and penalize the city.

There was intense discussion concerning who constituted a property owner. The city attorney interpreted the city charter as stating that a property owner was one who possessed a recorded deed. People buying property on land sales contract, he said, were not property owners.

Meanwhile, outcome of petition signer's move to make the remonstrance valid is still unknown. Property owners have signified their intent to carry the fight to Circuit court. A hearing has not yet been scheduled.
