

## Nazi Leader Is Suicide

MUNICH, Germany. — (AP) — The chief judge of the Nazi party supreme court, Reichsleiter Walter Buch, committed suicide by slashing his wrists and jumping into Ammer Lake, Bavarian state police announced Monday.

Buch's body was dragged from the lake last Friday evening. Police said they did not know the exact date on which Buch killed himself or the motive for his deed.

Buch was adjudged a major offender in two denazification trials. At the second trial last July, however, the Munich appellate court reduced his forced-labor sentence from five years to the time he had already been under arrest—3½ years.

## Honor Student Paroled to Dad

OREGON CITY — (AP) — A Chicago High School honor student was paroled to his father by Judge Earl C. Latourette after the parent pleaded that an attempted burglary resulted from three weeks in bad company.

Dean Arthur Culver, 19, Chicago, was sentenced to 5 years and immediately paroled to his father, Bernard W. Culver, a Chicago engineer. The father told the court that the boy had graduated with honors and recently won an architectural scholarship to the Illinois Institute of technology.

Culver was arrested at Jennings Lodge last Wednesday with Leslie Allan Jacobson, 18, also of Chicago. They were thwarted in their burglary attempt by Edward Whittington, owner of the ice cream parlor in which they were caught.

Their car was crammed with stolen goods admittedly taken in a series of robberies while traveling west.

District Attorney Leonard L. Linds said Clark County, Wash., authorities have released their "hold" warrant on Culver. Jacobson also has pleaded guilty to a similar charge.

## Bethel Records Pupil Increase

BETHEL — Enrollment in grades one through six, School District No. 52, has increased 21.5 per cent over the September, 1948, enrollment, according to Tom Powers, superintendent of schools.

Powers made the announcement after opening of school Monday. A total of 605 children have been registered in the first six grades. Last year's total enrollment was 498.

Following is the enrollment in the three grade schools of District No. 52: Erving, 135; Bethel, 215, and Danebo, 254. In 1948, Irving School enrolled 120; Bethel School, 188, and Danebo School, 180.

Total enrollment of Willamette High School will not be determined until after September 28, opening date of the new junior and senior high school.

## Oklahoma Revives 'Draft Eisenhower'

OKLAHOMA CITY, Okla. — (AP) — Oklahoma Republicans are reviving a "Draft Eisenhower for President" movement.

Harold Brand, an Oklahoma City realtor and president of State Eisenhower Clubs in 1948, announced rebirth of the campaign to put Gen. Dwight Eisenhower in the White House as state Republicans met here.

## McCarran to Visit Europe and Vatican

WASHINGTON — (AP) — Sen. Pat McCarran (D.-Nev.) preparing to leave for a study of displaced persons and economic recovery in Europe, says he also will visit Premier Francisco Franco to see if there is a "trend toward democracy" in Spain.

McCarran, chairman of the Senate Judiciary Committee which has bottled up President Truman's bill to admit more DPs to this country, said he probably will include in his three-week itinerary a talk with Pope Pius XI at the Vatican.

## Overlaps Hit In Reclamation Site

SEATTLE — (AP) — A "tremendous overlapping and powerful competition" between the Army Engineers and the Reclamation Service was cited this week by a former director of the National Park Service and member of the Hoover study commission.

Horace M. Albright, president of the U.S. Potash Co., and a member of the Hoover Commission study group on reclamation, mining and natural resources, said that millions of dollars could be saved if recommended reorganization would be carried out.

"The two agencies, doing the same kind of work, are competing for funds," he said. "We strongly recommended that the two agencies be combined. But there you run into difficulty. The Army Engineers, with only about 200 commissioned engineers concerned, have 30,000 civilians working for them. The Reclamation Service also is a powerful agency."

Albright said that neither agency wants to be stripped of its individual powers and funds. However, he asserted, they should be appraised in the national interest so that no duplication of energy and funds occurs.

## Refugee Hides From Russia

LOS ANGELES — (AP) — Polish stowaway Edward Tomolla, 25, said he would commit suicide if immigration officers deport him to his homeland inside the "Iron Curtain."

He arrived here Saturday after hiding aboard four ships. Tomolla, a member of the Polish underground, said he was tortured in a Communist concentration camp for five months before escaping.

The young Pole charged that his father and brother were executed in 1946 for voting against Communism and said his mother was killed during a wartime air raid.

Immigration authorities, who held Tomolla after the French Liner SS Washington docked here, appointed a board of inquiry to study his case.

## Drury Well Set For Fair Job

Earl Drury, Fall Creek, who will superintend the swine division at the Lane County Fair, is what fair officials call "well qualified" for the job.

Drury, who entered his Hereford swine in the State Fair at Salem, came away with the following honors:

First in junior yearling boar; first in senior yearling spring boar; first in aged sow; second in senior yearling sow; first in junior yearling sow; first in senior sow pig; first in senior spring sow pig; second and third in junior spring sow pig.

Senior and grand champion boar; junior and reserve champion boar; junior and grand champion sow; second and third in light barrow.

## Crew Escapes Flaming Plane

SAN JOSE, Cal. — (AP) — Twelve airforce crewmen, who parachuted safely from a flaming B-29 Super-Fortress bomber minutes before it crashed and exploded, Tuesday said there "was nothing to it."

"All we had to do was hit the silk. It was simple," one crewman said.

The huge plane crashed Monday in the rough brushy hill area near Calaveras Dam in northeastern Santa Clara County. All of the men landed with only minor scratches and bruises.

Meanwhile, Air Force authorities were investigating the crash. Captain Charles A. Grice, 26, pilot of the plane, said one of the bomber's four engines started to "act up" just after takeoff from Fairfield-Suisun Air Base.


Grice gave orders to bail out when flames erupted from the engine cowl. The plane "starting shaking apart," he said. Two brush fires were touched off by the flaming craft, but both were brought under control by Forest Service firefighters.
