

Insurance Firms To Be Investigated

WASHINGTON — (AP) — An investigation of taxation of life insurance companies was voted this week by the House Ways and Means Committee.

Chairman Doughton (D-NC) will appoint a seven-member subcommittee for the inquiry.

The investigation was ordered after the treasury reported that life insurance companies, under a special formula set up in the 1942 Revenue Act, paid no taxes on approximately \$1,500,000,000 not the companies earned on their investments in 1948.

The 1942 formula, committee experts explained, gave life insurance companies credits or deductions on certain portions of their net investment income in consideration of the companies' future obligations to policyholders.

Prices Blamed In Olds Fight

WASHINGTON — (AP) — Sen. James E. Murray (D-Mont) charges that oil and gas companies opposing the renomination of Leland Olds to the Federal Power Commission hope to collect \$10 billion in higher prices.

Murray interrupted Senate consideration of farm legislation to support President Truman in his uphill fight for Olds' reappointment. He also tangled with Sen. Robert S. Kerr (D-Okla.) over whether a producer has the right to sell his goods for the best price.

The issue arose after Sen. Homer E. Capehart (R-Ind.) accused Mr. Truman of resorting to Communist "party discipline" tactics in an effort to win Senate approval of the nomination. The Senate is expected to act Friday.

Capehart is a member of the Senate Commerce Committee which voted 10 to 2 to recommend Senate rejection of the appointment.

Referring to attacks on Olds during committee hearings, Murray appealed for support from all senators who know the nominee "is not a Communist, that he is not an enemy of private enterprise, that he is not a traitor or a punk or any of the cheap and disgraceful things that were thrown at him."

Describing the immediate issue as "the price of natural gas," Murray said that "ten billion dollars is a conservative estimate of what the oil and gas companies hope to extract from the public when they get Olds out of the way."

Capehart criticized Mr. Truman in a statement inserted in the Congressional Record.

Britons Face Job Changes

LONDON — (AP) — Sir Stafford Cripps served notice on British workers Wednesday that some may have to give up their present jobs and go to work in dollar-earning industries.

"We now have a greatly improved opportunity to get into the dollar markets, which we must seize," the Chancellor of the Exchequer told a news conference.

"That will undoubtedly entail some change in our pattern of employment."

During the war the government exercised the right to direct British working men and women into jobs where they were most needed. The government still has the right but has not been using it.

Cripps did not say that it intends to use it again, but he did say:

"Full employment does not and can never mean that every individual job is guaranteed for as long as the present occupant wishes to stay in it. That would be industrial stagnation."

Employment in Britain at the end of July totalled \$22,200,000, excluding members of the armed forces, the chancellor said. This is one per cent greater than a year ago. The number of unemployed is around 300,000.

Cripps said production in Britain is rising steadily.
