Red Suspects In Portland Win Trial Stay

PORTLAND — (P) — The deportation hearing of John L. Stenson, West Linn, was postponed indefinitely this week after defense objections to Communist pamphlets offered in evidence by the government.

Stenson is one of four Oregon residents accused of being aliens affiliated with subversive groups.

Background a Mystery

The Immigration Service, which has yet to disclose details of its case against the four, carried the mystery further Tuesday.

Defense attorneys demanded to know the name of the subversive organization to which Stenson is accused of belonging. The Immigration Service attorney replied he did not know the name — that learning the name was the purpose of the hearing.

Paul Crouch, who identified himself as a former Communist, testified at length of Communist party policy and workings. It was the apparent intent of the Immigration Service to qualify him as an expert on Communism.

Exhibits at Fault

It all ended, though, when the government sought to introduce the Communist pamphlets. These bore handwritten notations. Defense attorneys objected that the notations might have been made by the prosecution, and so were not true copies of the original.

Inspector Louis C. Hafferman, presiding at the hearing, then adjourned the affair indefinitely.

The cases of Samimimo Absolar, Hamish Scott McKay and Karolina Halvorsen, all of Portland, also were postponed.

Local Turkeys To Be Sent To All World

All Over Nation

The men responsible for the 8th annual Pacific Coast Turkey Exhibit, to be held here Nov. 15-18, decided to invite President Truman and the 48 governors to join President Inonu, No. 1 Thanksgiving Day "guest observer," in celebration of the great American holiday. A sort of international goodwill feast; dark meat and white meat compliments of McMinnville.

So Nov. 19, the day after the turkey show here closes, planes will launch a mass turkey flight from McMinnville Airport to the capitals of all the 48 states, to Washington, D.C.—and to Istanbul.

The grand champion dressed turkey of the Pacific Coast Exhibit will be flown to Washington for President Truman. And top quality broad breasted bronze beauties, ready to roast, will take off — by plane — for governors of the 48 states, from Earl Warren of California on the Pacific Coast to Thomas E. As for the Pacific Coast Turkey Exhibit itself, the prize toms and hens will be exhibited in immaculate cages in the National Guard Armory. Orchestra, singers and others brought in to entertain the visitors will have to compete with the cage confusion. It'll be bebop and rebop against "Gobble! Gobble! Gobble!"
