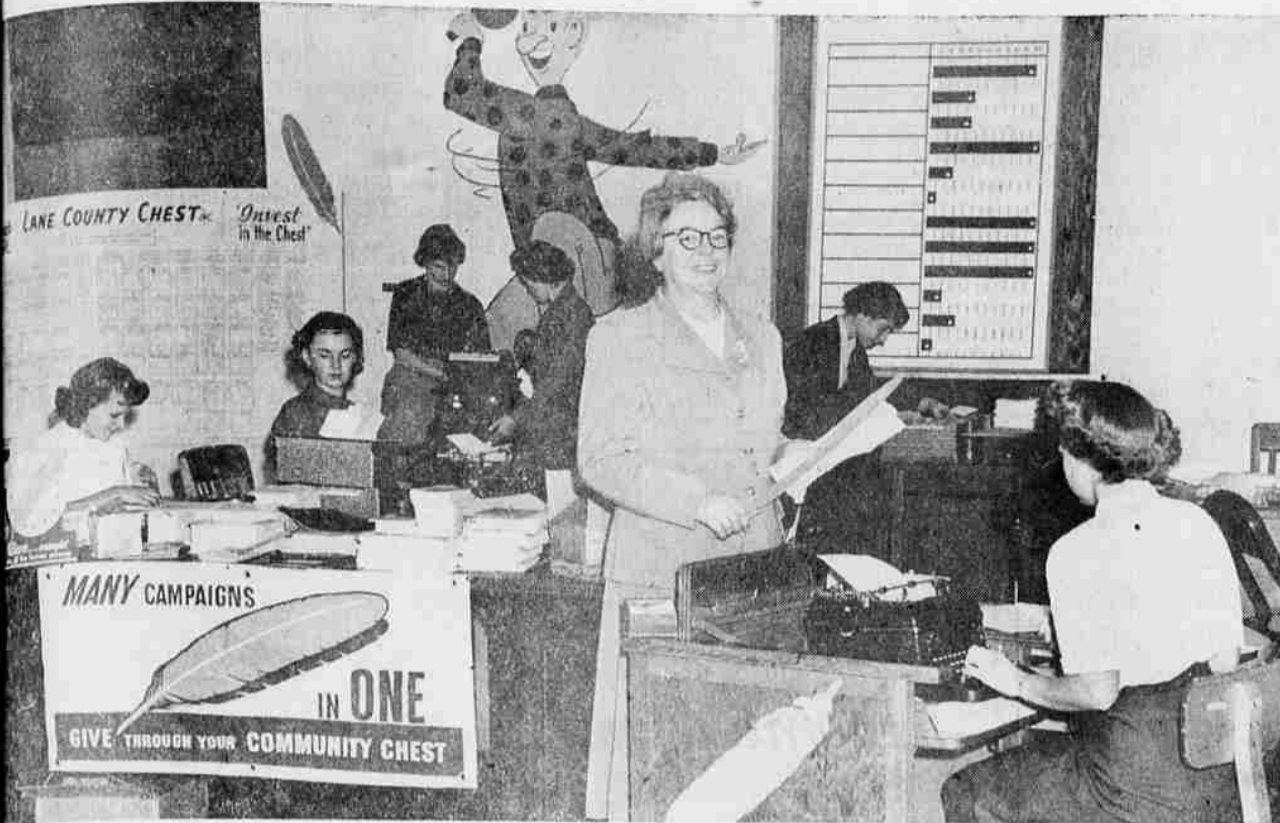

Women Start Campaign For Community Chest

If the doorbell rings in the next few days, probably it will be some woman of the neighborhood calling to ask about a contribution to the Community Chest. Monday is the day when the women's campaign starts to cover the entire residential district of Eugene and environs, to meet a quota of \$11,000.

Under the general chairmanship of Mrs. Tauf Charneski, scores of women will be working until the campaign ends Nov. 2.

The boundaries of School District No. 4, already mapped, were taken as a basis for marking divisions in this campaign. Mrs. L. J. Fuller is chairman of District 1, the Santa Clara-River Road area, and north of 11th St. Mrs. Roy S. Woodruff, Mrs. Paul Gray and Mrs. Jan Hoogstad serve as majors under her, and over 13 captains.

Chairman of District 2 is Mrs. Charles G. Mollier, hers all the territory north of the river in the Willakenzie area. Mrs. Austin John, Mrs. Charles Campbell and Mrs. O. C. Burkhart are

majors under her, and there are 12 captains assisting.

Heading District 3, east of Willamette St. and to the city limits, is Mrs. Willis Warren as chairman with Mrs. R. V. Thompson, Mrs. L. L. Daily, Mrs. Herald D. Oatsorn, Mrs. George Bullat, Mrs. Stuart Martin, Mrs. Carl Hultaker, Mrs. Everett Davis, Mrs. Byron Elliott, Mrs. E. A. Goodnough and Mrs. W. S. Beldinger as majors. There are 15 captains working with them.

Mrs. Irving A. Henning is chairman of District 4, west of Willamette and south of 11th St., including Bailey Hill. Her majors are Mrs. Alton Owen, Mrs. Ralph Frazier, Mrs. Clay Baxter, Mrs. E. E. Hellman, and they have a crew of 18 captains.

Under these nearly 60 captains in all four districts, there are block workers, whose numbers really total up. But as Mrs. Charneski has said, the only way to be successful in a Community Chest campaign is for everyone to work for complete coverage. After all, it serves us all, she says.
