

Grove School Sets Yuletide

Music Department, Thespians, Combine

COTTAGE GROVE — The high school music department and Thespians will combine efforts to present the school's annual Christmas program Dec. 14. The program will begin at 8 p.m. in the high school auditorium.

The Thespians will present a play entitled "A Bed of Hay." The play depicts the scene of a stableyard of an inn at the outskirts of Bethlehem in Judea.

"Oh Come All Ye Faithful" will be sung as a procession to open the Christmas program. The choir will sing "Holly and Ivy" and "Carol of the Bells" to be followed by "Oh Little Town of Bethlehem" and "Today There is Ringing."

The girls chorus and boys chorus will also present Christmas carols.

Jim Grewelle, a choir member, will sing "Sweet Little Jesus Boy." The high school band will also play two numbers.

The choir will give an unusual arrangement of a "Silent Night" sequence with an echo choir. Richard Lindner, faculty member, will furnish the violin solo.

BLM Seeks Storm Report

Otto C. F. Krueger, Eugene District Forester for the Bureau of Land Management announced Thursday that a large volume of O. & C. timber went down during the recent storm. The district staff is currently busy attempting to locate as much of this material as possible.

Krueger wishes to sell this timber not only to prevent the waste of a valuable resource but to curb any increase in the already alarming bark beetle situation. During the past summer, trained entomologists examining the Eugene area noted that there is an increasing number of trees dying due to bark beetle infestation. These beetles breed in dead and down timber and spread from there into the surrounding live trees. The waste amount of blowdown now in the woods will provide excellent breeding grounds for ever increasing numbers of beetles unless this timber can be quickly removed.

In order to expedite the location and sale of this material the district forester invites anyone knowing of such blowdown on O. & C. or Public Domain lands to report it to the Eugene office of the Bureau of Land Management. It would help if those reporting could give township, range, section and subdivision wherever possible. An estimate of the number of down trees and their volume is also invited.
