Springfield Man Hurt In Mill Accident

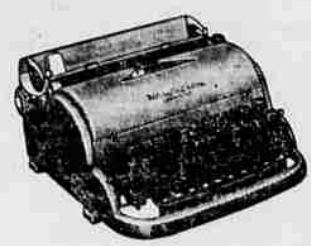
