PORTLAND, (AP) — A spray, to be made available to Oregon farmers, will permit purer seed crops, the Oregon Seed Growers' League was told here today.

Earl Freed, Oregon State College agronomist, described the spray. It is a development of which rescue growers are achieving good results in controlling weeds and other grasses in their rescue fields.

Better Results

The new spray, known as IPC, will give even better results, he said.

**Hartung Wins
IWA Election**

**Just Lived Too Long,
97 Year Old Decides**

MONTGOMERY, Ala. — (AP) — "My one mistake was that I outlived my money."

That's how 97-year old Thomas Linton McCullough sums up his fate which tumbled him from a once-wealthy cotton planter to a broke nonagenarian living in a boarding house on a \$50-a-month old age pension.

Before he retired 22 years ago, McCullough built up a fabulous fortune which kept the wolf away from his door until six months ago. That's when the money ran out.

Based on Parent's Ages

McCullough, still an erect figure with a flowing white beard, explains it this way:

"Both my mother and father died at 72 and I reckoned I couldn't exceed this by more than eight years."

So, at the age of 75, he retired with what he thought was enough money in the bank to last him the rest of his life.

'One Last Fling'

At 80, McCullough revealed, he bought an airplane for "one last fling" across the continent, into Mexico and South America.

"I figured three or four more years would take me out."

But when he returned three years later, he was still going strong.

Will Repeat Mistake

As the years rolled on past the 85, 90 and 95-year marks, the "last flings" continued and so did McCullough. His money gave out first.

But there's one thing you can bet on, McCullough says with a glint in his eye. That one mistake of living too long "is an error I'm going to go on making just as long as I can."

**Portlander Resigns
As Finance Head**

PORTLAND — (AP) — Abe G. Gilbert, fund raiser in the 1948 campaign, has resigned as chairman of the State Democratic Central Committee's finance committee.

William L. Josselin, party state chairman, announced the resignation Monday.

Gilbert, a Portland furniture dealer, said his resignation was the outgrowth of a dispute at a meeting of the General Committee last month. He was quoted as saying businessmen should be solicited for party contributions in return for consideration from the administration.

Gilbert said that this quotation, taken from its context, gave the wrong impression.

He also said he and State Democratic leaders, including National Committeeman Monroe Sweetland, held divergent viewpoints. This made his job impossible, he said.

Josselin said no successor has been chosen.
