

# Gun Okay, Supreme Court Hears Cases On Appeal of Mrs. Hansen

SALEM (Special) — Oral arguments on the appeal from judgment of the Benton County Circuit Court in the case of Margaret Hansen were heard for two hours Wednesday morning in Oregon's Supreme Court.

Mrs. Hansen was convicted of first degree murder with recommendation of leniency on Jan. 12, 1951, on an indictment charging her with crushing her husband, Sigurd Hansen, to death with a motor vehicle in September of 1950. The trial began Jan. 2, 1951, the jury bringing in its verdict on Jan. 12 of that year.

**Opening Argument**

Bruce Spaulding, Portland attorney and former Polk County district attorney, gave the opening argument for the appellant, and Karl T. Huston, who represented the defense in the trial, presented the closing argument.

Both Spaulding and Huston reiterated their contention that "there was absolutely no evidence" to show there was any intentional use of the car by Mrs. Hansen to kill her husband, and no evidence whatsoever that she had any intention or plan to kill him. In their arguments they stated, "There is no evidence of premeditation as claimed in the State's theory, and also there is no evidence of the commission of any crime by Mrs. Hansen and that the jury was permitted to base a verdict against her upon pure speculation and suspicion."

# Chief Howard Tells Activities

Drunks accounted for most Springfield Police Department arrests during December, Police Chief Harry Howard has reported.
