

## Farmers Co-op Has New Store

Annual Meet Set  
In New Building

The Eugene Farmers Co-op, a cooperative farm supply store, is moving to a new location.

Manager Herman A. Hein said the move to the new building, at 675 McKinley (just west of the Big Y Market), will be completed early this week. The new structure, a 40 by 140 foot frame and metal sheeting building, was constructed by members of the co-op, Hein said. It includes a farm equipment repair shop.

The local co-op has about 400 members, in addition to serving other farmers who are not members. It handles farm building supplies, general farm supplies, farm appliances, and oils and gasoline.

At present the co-op will continue to sell oil and gasoline from its bulk tank plant on 5th Ave. in the 1600 block. That will be moved to the new location later this year, Hein said.

The former location of the farm store was 1585 W. 7th Ave.

Hein said members of the co-op will hold their annual meeting in the new building on Feb. 25.

## Parents Fire Tough Teacher

FORKS OF SALMON, Calif. (AP) — The feud between parents and schoolmarm Martha Freeman over her "robust western language" is over, but a month's vacation enjoyed by the kids may be continued.

Some 20 pupils are banking on heavy snows in this Northern California area to prevent the replacement teach — Roy Headley of Oakland, Calif. — from arriving by Monday.

The schoolmarm was accused by the parents of beating pupils and using cusswords. She denied this.

For the first 14 days of the feud, Miss Freeman raised the flag each morning and sat alone in her empty school because the parents kept the children away.

But Friday she agreed to let the school board buy up the rest of her contract for \$800.

## Diesels Called Health Hazard

CHICAGO — (AP) — The increasing use of diesel locomotives has created a new industrial health hazard, according to an article in the American Medical Association's Journal.

The article was written by Drs. John R. Winston and Edmond N. Walsh, who are associated with the Scott and White clinic of the Gulf, Colorado and Santa Fe Hospital.

They said chromate salt compounds used in diesel locomotive radiator fluid can cause serious, crippling skin inflammations.

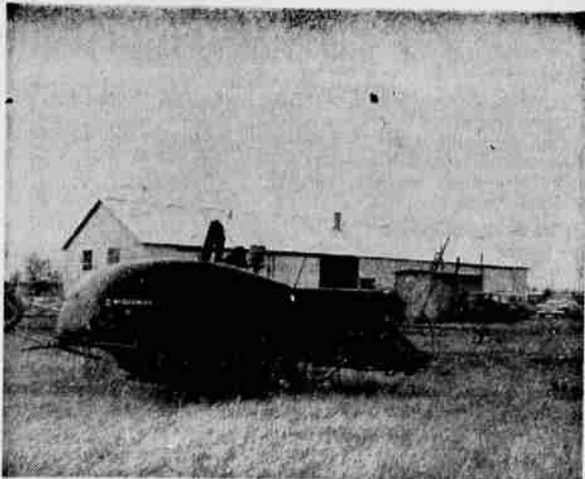
There is a high rate of sensitivity to such compounds, the doctors said. They recommend that workers who are exposed to the fluid wear rubber gloves and boots, waterproof aprons and sleeves.

## 'Fourth Worst Year' For Polio Cases

SALEM — (AP) — Last year was the fourth worst polio year in Oregon's history, with 370 cases reported, Gov. Douglas McKay said last week.

The total was 150 less than in 1950.

The governor said 35 per cent of the cases involved patients more than 20 years old.

About 18 per cent of the cases were of the bulbar or respiratory type, which is the most severe of all types. Fifty one per cent were spinal paralysis, 23 per cent were non-paralytic, and 8 per cent were unspecified.
