

Reserve Officer Program Begun

The Navy is launching a two-year drive Jan. 9-23 for men and women reserve officer candidates.

University of Oregon students enrolled in the reserve officer candidate programs are Ferguson and Jane Rey, majors in architecture, and Ralph Wacker, a student in health.

According to LCDR George Ensign, the advantages for men students are many. The ROC trainees are subject to the draft or in-service recall. His summer training, which qualifies him for commission when he completes college work, does not interfere with his academic year. He draws pay and allowances while in training.

The men, co-eds are commissioned ensigns in the Naval Reserve upon completion of two years' sessions of the ROC(W) program and graduation from college. They draw the same pay allowances as the men while in training. Ninety-three different ROC(W) School at Great Lakes.

School Board To Set Election

Springfield's school board will probably set a date for a proposed \$900,000 bond issue when it meets Monday at 7:30 p. m. in the school administration offices.

The board, at a preliminary meeting a few weeks ago, unofficially approved the election. Superintendent E. H. Silke outlined at that time a program for the next three years which would also add \$200,000 per year for a cash levy under the school budget. The \$1,500,000 would be used for necessary school buildings and extra classrooms.

Members have approved setting up legal machinery, to be okayed at Monday's meet, for the election.

Money can be given area chairmen or mailed to Lane County TB Assn., Rm. 217, IOOF Building, Eugene.

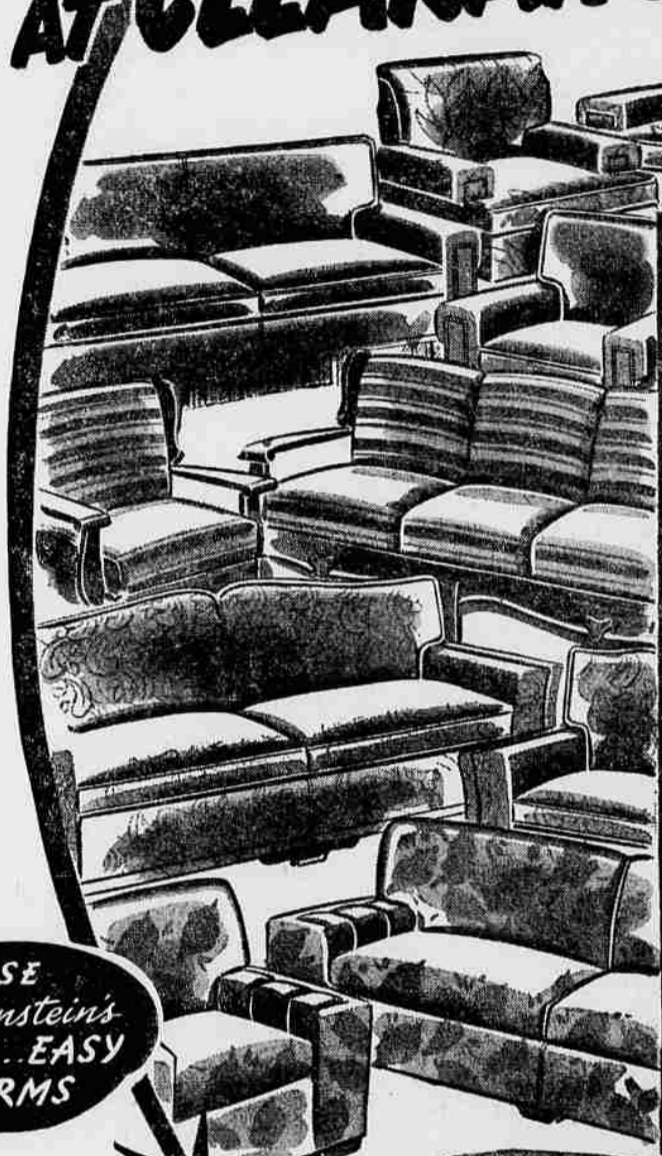

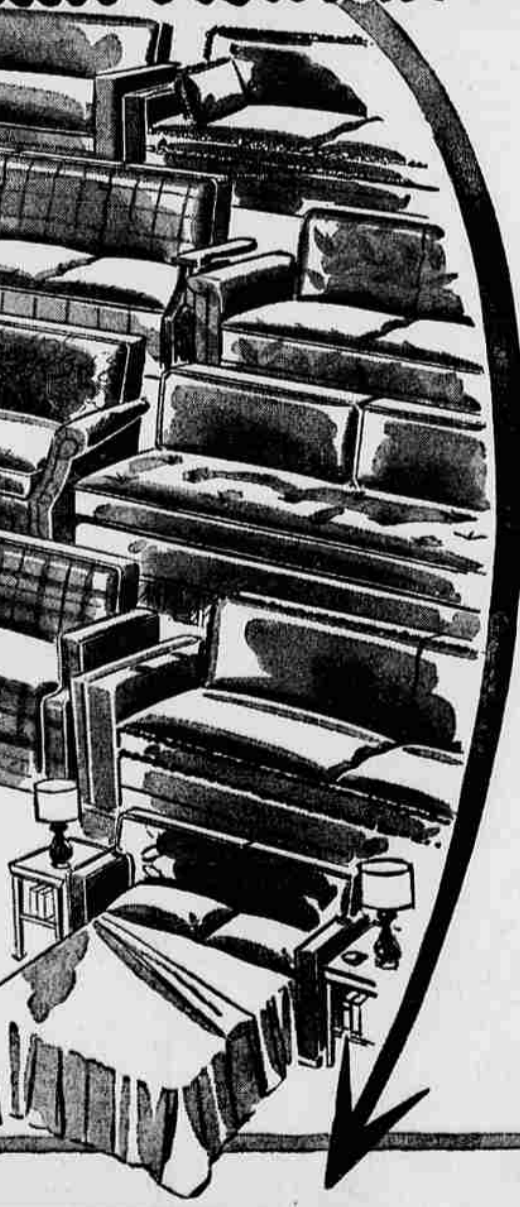
